DIOCESAN NEWS

St. Joseph's Parish & St. Anthony's Parish Congratulate and Welcome Bishop Stephen Jensen



Bishop Jensen was installed as Bishop of Prince George at a special Mass of Ordination held April 2nd, 2013 at Sacred Heart Cathedral. The Most Reverend J. Michael Miller, CSB, Archbishop of Vancouver was the Principal Consecrator with Bishops David Monroe of Kamloops, British Columbia and Brian Dunn of Antigonish, Nova Scotia as co-consecrators.

COAT OF ARMS

The shield is divided by an angled line pointing upwards to the centre. In the upper section is a white star and on either side a white Pacific dogwood flower, all on a blue background. The lower section uses a pattern of red flames on a white background.

The angled division alludes to a mountain and thus to Bishop Jensen's birthplace in North Vancouver and his ministry in British Columbia, and the blue background alludes to the Pacific Ocean. The dogwood flowers are the provincial flower of British Columbia and are also found in the arms of the Archdiocese of Vancouver, in which Bishop Jensen has served for over 30 years. The star is a symbol of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and it can also represent the North Star and his new responsibilities in northern British Columbia as Bishop of Prince George. The flames are a symbol of education and knowledge, and they refer to a particular focus of Bishop Jensen's ministry, education, in which he has a doctoral degree. They also allude to his apostolic ministry as a bishop, as flames appeared above the heads of the apostles at Pentecost.

The Motto, **PARARE VIAS EIUS**, means **"To prepare His ways."** This is from the song of Zechariah in Luke 1.76, a reference to the mission of St. John the Baptist as prophesied by Isaiah.

The hat with six tassels on either side and the cross are emblematic of the hierarchical status of the Episcopal office, and are present on every Roman Catholic bishop's coat of arms. The Arms are placed on a processional cross.

PARISH MINISTRIES

Administration of the Sacraments

BAPTISM. Baptismal Preparation is held once a month at the Church.

CONFIRMATION. In our Diocese, Confirmation & First Eucharist are celebrated together in Grade 2. Sacramental Preparations begin in January. Both parents and children are required to participate at the Sacramental Preparations.

EUCHARIST. Eucharist is celebrated daily, please see front of the Bulletin for specific Mass times. Mass intentions may be offered by contacting the parish office.

RECONCILIATION. Celebrated by those who have already received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist.) Parish Reconciliation is available every Saturday evening before the Anticipated Mass or by appointment.

MARRIAGE. Please make an appointment with the pastor, at least six months before the intended marriage date. Marriage Preparation may then be arranged.

HOLY ORDERS. Any person interested to become a priest. please see the pastor.

ANNOINTING OF THE SICK. Parish care for the sick and homebound, please phone the parish office for a pastoral visit.



The 50 Days of Easter

Which season is longer, Christmas or Easter? Well, <u>Easter Sunday</u> is just one day, while there are <u>12 days of Christmas</u>, right? Well, yes and no.

As <u>l've discussed before</u>, the Christmas season actually lasts 40 days, from <u>Christmas Day</u> until <u>Candlemas</u>, the Feast of the Presentation, on February 2. The 12 days of Christmas refer to the most festive part of the season, from Christmas Day until <u>Epiphany</u>.

Similarly, the period from Easter Sunday through <u>Divine Mercy Sunday</u> (the Sunday after Easter Sunday), also known as the Octave (or eighth day) of Easter, is an especially joyful time. But the Easter season doesn't end there: Because Easter is the most important feast in the Christian calendar—even more important than Christmas—the Easter season continues on for 50 days, through the <u>Ascension of</u> <u>Our Lord</u> to <u>Pentecost Sunday</u>. (Indeed, for the purpose of fulfilling our Easter Duty, the Easter season extends until <u>Trinity Sunday</u>, the first Sunday after Pentecost!)

So keep on celebrating and wishing your friends a happy Easter! As <u>St. John Chrysostom</u> reminds us in his famous <u>Easter homily</u>, read in Eastern Catholic and Eastern Orthodox churches on Easter, Christ has destroyed death, and now is the "feast of faith." *Catholicism.about.com*
