Administration of the Sacraments

BAPTISM. Baptismal Preparation is held once a month at the Church.

CONFIRMATION. In our Diocese, Confirmation & First Eucharist are celebrated together in Grade 2. Sacramental Preparations begin in January. Both parents and children are required to participate at the Sacramental Preparations.

EUCHARIST. Eucharist is celebrated daily, please see front of the Bulletin for specific Mass times. Mass intentions may be offered by contacting the parish office.

RECONCILIATION. Celebrated by those who have already received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist.) Parish Reconciliation is available every Saturday evening before the Anticipated Mass or by appointment.

MARRIAGE. Please make an appointment with the pastor, at least six months before the intended marriage date. Marriage Preparation may then be arranged.

HOLY ORDERS. Any person interested to become a priest. please see the pastor.

ANNOINTING OF THE SICK. Parish care for the sick and homebound, please phone the parish office for a pastoral visit.

Pastoral Care to the Sick and the Dying

Within the Roman Catholic community, ministry to the sick and dying is greatly valued. Through prayer, pastoral visits to the sick, the celebration of the sacraments, and the com-



mendation of the dead, the Church's ministers (ordained and lay) continue the compassionate ministry of Jesus Christ.

WHEN SOMEONE IS SERIOUSLY ILL, contact the parish immediately and let the priest know. When someone in your family or a friend is seriously sick or confined to home for a period of time, contact the parish immediately. Let Fr. Rector know of the person's illness. Depending on the circumstances, a priest or lay minister may be available to visit, pray with the sick person and perhaps bring Communion. A priest may also celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing with the sick person. In every case, the parish community can support the sick person with prayer. When someone is seriously sick, it is important to contact the parish immediately; don't wait until the person is unconscious or nearing death.

NOTE: Due to privacy issues the priest cannot just visit to the hospital without the person who is sick or the family requesting it.

Why we receive the ashes Following the example of the Nine vites, who did penance in sackcloth and ashes, our foreheads are marked with ashes to humble our hearts and reminds us that life passes away on Earth. We remember this when we are told "Remember, Man is dust, and unto dust you shall return."

Ashes are a symbol of penance made sacramental by the blessing of the Church, and they help us develop a spirit of humility and sacrifice. The distribution of ashes comes from a ceremony of ages past. Christians who had committed grave faults performed public penance. On Ash Wednesday, the Bishop blessed the hair shirts which they were to wear during the forty days of penance, and sprinkled over them ashes made from the palms from the previous year. Then, while the faithful recited the Seven Penitential Psalms, the penitents were turned out of the church because of their sins -- just as Adam, the first man, was turned out of Paradise because of his disobedience. The penitents did not enter the church again until Maundy Thursday after having won reconciliation by the toil of forty days' penance and sacramental absolution. Later, all Christians, whether public or secret penitents, came to receive ashes out of devotion. In earlier times, the distribution of ashes was followed by a penitential procession.

The Ashes. The ashes are made from the blessed palms used in the Palm Sunday celebration of the previous year. The ashes are christened with Holy Water and are scented by exposure to incense. While the ashes symbolize penance and contrition, they are also a reminder that God is gracious and merciful to those who call on Him with repentant hearts. His Divine mercy is of utmost importance during the season of Lent, and the Church calls on us to seek that mercy during the entire Lenten season with reflection, prayer and penance. <u>www.catholic.org/clife/lent/</u>
