Pastor's Notes



Renewing Children's Catechesis

New Resources

The Canadian Bishops' Conference announced last September that it would no longer publish the series of catechism texts known as "Born of the Spirit" (formerly "Come to the Father"). This means that every diocese must choose new catechetical resources. Fortunately, there are a number of

very good options available.

Late last year, Fr. Jack Michalchuk and Mr. John Connolly, codirectors of the diocesan Office of Evangelization and Catechesis, began a consultation with pastors, parents, parish catechists and Catholic school principals and teachers to identify the best resources to meet our needs.

After this thorough process, the "Alive in Christ" series produced by Our Sunday Visitor has been chosen as the primary resource for use in parishes and schools, beginning in September 2014. In addition, resources produced by Loyola Press will be used for immediate preparation for the Sacraments of Penance and the Holy Eucharist. The "Alive in Christ" series is very user friendly, with many features that can make our efforts to form children in the Faith more effective, including tools for parents to reinforce what is learned in the classroom and extensive online resources available at www.aliveinchristosv.com. An important additional advantage is the publisher's readiness to come to the diocese at its own expense to provide in-service for Catholic school teachers and parish catechists.

Assistance from the Diocese To obtain the best price through bulk ordering, the diocese will purchase the texts and bill the parishes and schools. Since adopting these new resources will be an extra expense, in the first year of implementation the diocese will offer subsidies to parishes and schools through the Religious Education Trust fund. More information about this will be provided soon.

Reception of the Sacraments

The search for new resources raised the issue of the order in which children receive the Sacraments. All the catechetical programs are premised on children receiving the Sacraments of Penance and the Holy Eucharist in the order the Church prescribes. Several years ago, the Congregation for the Discipline of the Sacraments and the Congregation for the Clergy issued a joint declaration indicating that an experiment carried out in some places whereby children received First Holy Communion before their first Confession had to end. The practice of putting the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation before the First Communion of children "must be obeyed everywhere and by all" (Sanctus Pontifex, May 24, 1973). The practice in the diocese will henceforth conform to this common discipline of the Church.

Continuation

If children are prepared for these two Sacraments at the age level of the second grade, adjustment to the age for receiving Confirmation is advisable.

The age for receiving Confirmation varies legitimately. For example, with recognition by the Holy See, the bishops of the United States decreed in 2012 that the age for Confirmation would be between the age of discretion (about seven) and about sixteen years of age. (The

Canadian bishops have not issued a decree on this matter.) To allow more time and opportunity for families, parishes and schools to prepare children, Confirmation will henceforth ordinarily be administered at the sixth grade level. A wealth of new resources is available for this formation and the Office of Evangelization and Catechesis will lead the process of choosing the best programs and materials for parishes and schools.

The extraordinary Synod of Bishops happening this fall in Rome will focus on families and their mission to share Faith and life in Christ. Our new catechetical resources should help families, parishes and schools become more effective in this work.

Rest in Peace, Fr. Nicholas Forde, OMI

We pray for the repose of the soul of Father Nicholas Forde, OMI, who died in Prince George on Friday, June 13th at the age of 81 years. Father Forde was born in Cardiff, Wales and ordained to the priesthood in the Congregation of Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate by Most Rev. Fergus O'Grady, OMI, in Kilkenny, Ireland on March 16, 1957. In 1977 he came to the Diocese of Prince George to work in Catholic Education with Bishop O'Grady and the Frontier Apostolate. He served as pastor of Immaculate Conception Parish in Prince George for 18 years. A prayer service for Father Forde was held on Friday, June 20th at Immaculate Conception Parish and the Funeral Mass took place on Saturday, June 21st at Sacred Heart Cathedral.

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi In the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) we read:

"The holy Eucharist completes Christian initiation. Those who have been raised to the dignity of the royal priesthood by Baptism and configured more deeply to Christ by Confirmation participate with the whole community in the Lord's own sacrifice

by means of the Eucharist." (CCC 1322).

The CCC quotes from the teachings of Vatican II when it says in paragraph 1323: "At the Last Supper, on the night he was betrayed, our Savior instituted the Eucharistic sacrifice of his Body and Blood. This he did in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the cross throughout the ages until he should come again, and so to entrust to his beloved Spouse, the Church, a memorial of his death and resurrection: a sacrament of love, a sign of unity, a bond of charity, a Paschal banquet 'in which Christ is consumed, the mind is filled with grace, and a pledge

of future glory is given to us.' "

The Church teaches that the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life." (CCC 1324) This means that, because Christ is really, truly and substantially present in the Eucharist, we recognize that all the graces we enjoy as Catholic Christians come from this great Sacrament, and all we aspire to, the fullness of the life of God, is

contained in this Sacrament.

"Because God is present in the Sacrament, we have the duty to render all praise, adoration and reverence to Him. The Church has faithfully celebrated the Eucharist from the beginning according to the Lord's command, in particular each Sunday, the day of His Resurrection. As early as the second century we have the witness of St. Justin Martyr for the basic lines of the order of the Eucharistic celebration, when he wrote to a pagan emperor to explain Christian worship, around the year 155. They have stayed the same until our own day." (CCC 1345).
