# PASTOR'S NOTE

### SUNDAY REFLECTION AND ACTION ITEM:


**LATE CONVERSION and DEEDS COUNT** are the two themes we take from the scriptures this week. It is a simple parable of two sons, one son promising but not delivering obedience, and the other son initially refusing but eventually offering obedience. The words of Jesus are clear that a late conversion is better than any illusion that we have need of no conversion. This conversion becomes real in deeds of action.

Continuing with a reference to the Diocesan Appeal where we are being asked to give our TIME, TALENT, and TREAS-URE to building together in faith, we can ask what conversion is God asking of us.. and we can do ONE THING DIFFER-ENTLY THIS WEEK with our time, our talents, or our treasure.

**The Diocese is gathering** for its annual STUDY DAYS. These days remind us of our need to be reviewing and deepening our understanding of faith. Pope Frances with his colourful life with the Jesuits, with liberation theology, and with life in Argentina, has produced a document called the Joy of the Gospel. We will be using this document as our resource. This document is available at the Vatican website.

The various parish ministry groups have met with me. First, I am grateful for their faithful commitment and participation; and second, I will be inviting many to join in ministry to bolster our numbers and to ensure that ministry is always a privilege and not a burden. It becomes a burden when a volunteer is always asked or when the volunteer is unable to do their ministry well because other spots are vacant.
