PASTOR'S NOTE

SUNDAY REFLECTION AND ACTION ITEM:

Jesus evades the trap... are we able? Jesus is aware of a trap. If he says that the people have to pay the taxes (something we all need to faithfully do because our governments need money to do things), then lesus will be upsetting the lewish people who wanted to be freed from the Roman oppression. If he says that the people do not need to pay the taxes, then he would be upsetting the Roman authority and you can be sure that he would be put into prison for teaching to break the law. Jesus evades the trap, but does not evade the question. He does this by raising the question to include God. "Give to the government what belongs to the government, and give to God what belongs to God." We also need to raise our eyes to a higher stance whenever we tackle the situations we find ourselves in. WWID (what would Jesus do) is a very good way to shape our lives. We need to avoid the trap of ignoring God (or Jesus or the Holy Spirit).

And just in case we now are wondering, "What belongs to God?", let us remember that we are made in the image of God. Therefore, if we have to give the coin to Caesar because it has an image of Caesar on it, then we have to give our complete selves to God because we are created in God's image and therefore belong to Him.

HOMEWORK: ask in prayer to see the image of God in me and others?

Mary, the call by Pope Francis to evangelize the Gospel with Joy. There was the Bishop and 10 priests on retreat. Thank you for your prayers.




Pope remembers two Canadian saints: Pope Francis remembered two Canadian saints, St.Francois Laval and St.Marie de l'Incarnation at the weekend mass of Oct 10. The two had been raised to the level of sainthood at a celebration on April 03. The Pope took the occasion of the Canadian Thanksgiving to refer to our gratitude for the examples of the saints that inspire us. I encourage people to look up these saints. Saint Francis de Laval was the first bishop of New France and known for his work to defend members of First Nations from exploitation. Saint Marie of the Incarnation was an Ursuline nun who founded a convent and school that provided equal education to the daughters of French settlers and members of First Nations.



FAMILY: Second General Congregation (fr. VIS continuation)

From many quarters, however, there has emerged the need to adapt the language of the Church, so that doctrine on the family, life and sexuality is understood correctly: it is necessary to enter into dialogue with the world, looking to the example offered by the Vatican Council, or rather with a critical but sincere openness.

Marriage is and remains an indissoluble sacrament; however, since the truth is Christ, a Person, and not a series of rules, it is important to maintain the principles while changing the concrete forms of their implementation. In short, as Benedict XVI said, novelty in continuity: the Synod does not call Doctrine into question, but reflects on the Pastoral, or rather spiritual discernment for the application of such Doctrine in response to the challenges faced by contemporary fami-

Another essential point is the rejection of clericalism: at times the Church seems more concerned with power than with service, and for this reason she does not inspire the hearts of men and women. It is therefore necessary to return to the imitation of Christ, and to rediscover humility: the reform of the Church must begin with the reform of the clergy. (end).
