

PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

"We are the Catholic Community of St. Joseph's Parish, gathered as disciples of Jesus Christ to worship God, to serve others and to grow as loving members of God's family."



The Final Things: judgement, heaven, hell, purgatory. In our creed we pray, 'I believe in everlasting life'. 'All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven' (Catechism #1030). In the process of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we confess our sins, accept our penance, and receive absolution. Our Penance is an expression of working with Jesus to repair the harm done through our sins; hence an incomplete penance shows itself as a 'stain of sin'. We believe that no sin and no stain of sin can enter into heaven; hence the reality of a purifying process, which we call purgatory. What purgatory is really like we do not know; but that a purifying process exists we can know.

The communion of Saints is the belief of the oneness (or communion) existing between the People of God on earth and those who have gone before us. This communion allows the people on earth to be of great help to those undergoing purgatory; in the same way that our acts of prayer on earth can help the people on earth, we believe that our acts of prayer can help those in purgatory. And this communion is a two-way street; hence those in heaven (the saints) can help us on our earthly pilgrimage through their prayers of intercession.

NOVEMBER: The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, All Souls' Day

The souls of all our faithful departed will be remembered in all the masses. Offering a mass intention, reflects the deep and unbroken Catholic conviction that the Eucharistic sacrifice has pre-eminence among the prayers, good works, alms and acts of religion which believers are encouraged to offer on behalf of the dead. This time of the year is a special time to remember our deceased loved ones through prayers and masses to be offered for them.

"Happy are those who have died in the Lord. Let them rest from their labours for their good deeds go with them."

Feast of Christ the King. This is our New Year's Eve. Today is the last week of this year of worship; next week we begin our New Year with Advent. We celebrate today our belief that Jesus is the King of all Kings. We affirm our faith that Jesus is the center of our lives, and that there is no aspect of our life that Jesus does not touch. This is taught in the words from today's Gospel, "Whatsoever you do to the least of my brothers and sisters, you do unto me." (Mt 25:40)

Development and Peace Update

Canadian Catholic Organization for DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE (CCOPD) is deeply disappointed that the federal government is not establishing an independent Ombudsman to investigate human rights complaints involving corporate activity abroad, as part of the five-year review of its Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Strategy announced on November 14, 2014. Our Fall 2013 campaign "A Voice for Justice" called for such an independent role.

Over 95,000 Canadians wrote to Parliament in the past year to call for the creation of an extractive-sector Ombudsman. Last month, a private member's bill to create such an Ombudsman, Bill C-584, received support from all opposition parties in Parliament but was voted down by the government.

"Ultimately, it is the most vulnerable communities adversely impacted by Canadian companies who will pay the highest price because they have no genuine recourse when their human rights are violated," said Josianne Gauthier, Deputy Executive Director of DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE.

Christ the King notes (From the Ordo):

The last week of the liturgical year is devoted to eschatological themes: Christ the King will restore all creation and restore his kingdom to the Father. The risen people of God will rejoice in a new heaven and a new earth. "There, with the whole of creation, freed from the corruption of sin and death, may we glorify you through Christ our Lord." (EP IV)

About Christ the King celebration

Pope Pius XI instituted The Feast of Christ the King in 1925 for the universal church in his encyclical Quas Primas. He connected the increasingly denial of Christ as king to the rise of secularism. At the time of Quas Primas, many Christians (including Catholics) began to doubt Christ's authority and existence, as well as the Church's power to continue Christ's authority. Pius XI, and the rest of the Christian world, witnessed the rise of non-Christian dictatorships in Europe, and saw Catholics being taken in by these earthly leaders. These dictators often attempted to assert authority over the Church. Just as the Feast of Corpus Christi was instituted when devotion to the Eucharist was at a low point, the Feast of Christ the King was instituted during a time when respect for Christ and the Church was waning, when the feast was needed most.

Pius hoped the institution of the feast would have various effects. They were:

- 1. That nations would see that the Church has the right to freedom, and immunity from the state (Quas Primas, 32).
- 2. That leaders and nations would see that they are bound to give respect to Christ (Quas Primas, 31).
- 3. That the faithful would gain strength and courage from the celebration of the feast, as we are reminded that Christ must reign in our hearts, minds, wills, and bodies (Quas Primas, 33).
