PARISH MISSION STATEMENT "We are the Catholic Community of St. Joseph's Parish, gathered as disciples of Jesus Christ to worship God, to serve others and to grow as loving members of God's family."



ADVENT. I appreciate how the Church has organized the readings of Advent so that we begin with the prize, eternal life, and then we move into the story of how of God opens up eternal life to us using the prophets, John the Baptism, and Mary. In the first Sunday of Advent, our readings will not be far from the end-of-time readings of the last few weeks which pointed to the second coming of Jesus. Week two and week three will have stories of John the Baptist as the precursor who was preparing the way for Jesus to come. And in week four we meet Mary who had to personally say 'yes' so that Jesus could be born among us. We must never loose sight of eternal life. We must cooperate with God to bring that gift to everyone.

During Advent and Christmas we will be highlighting the Word of God. In our celebrations we will show this by displaying the Scriptures prominently to encourage people to see the Word of God as living among us. In our homes I would ask that we pay special attention to how we speak and listen to one another, and I will refer to suggestions from scripture like Ephesisan 4:29 "use kind words that build people up", or from Proverbs 15:4, "the tongue that brings healing is a tree of life, but a deceitful tongue crushes the spirit." Advent is filled with images of how God speaks with us. Let us use this time of Advent to improve how we speak to one another.

COMMIT TO STUDYING DURING ADVENT. The ministry of the Word highlighted in Advent is connected to the ministry of the prophet which is connected to the ministry of teaching/studying. We are reviving two past practices and advertising one current practice of opportunities to study. Four times a year we bring in the periodical 'Daily Faith' which is a little booklet containing a prayer reflection for every day. We are making available again copies of 'The Word Among Us' which is a Catholic periodical that contains our scripture readings for Advent and wonderful inspirational and educational articles. And we are bringing out the church library **books** and encouraging people to take a book home.

The procedure for the church library books is as follows: please take a book home and simply return it when you are finished or pass it on to someone who might be interested in reading the book. If you have books to donate, please bring them to the Office. Please note that books approved by the Catholic Church will have the latin term 'imprimatur' located near the title page. You may find books with views divergent from the Catholic faith, and I have included these because it is good to hear what others have to say and to formulate our own responses. Please feel free to come and discuss anything you read with me – I enjoy a good faith discussion.

LITURGICAL MINISTRY WORKSHOP. Second opportunity on Wednesday, Dec 03 from 7pm to 8:30pm. Please mark your calendars. The first portion will be general teaching on the importance and place of worship in our Catholic faith, and the second part will go into specific procedures. I invite all people to learn about our liturgical ministries even if at present you do not feel called to minister.

Thank you to everyone who came to the first workshop. I enjoyed your dedication and your faith, and your willingness to deepen your faith life. I strongly encourage people to come to this second opportunity.

Homework: Watch how you speak and commit to studying something faith-filled.

During Advent, each Sunday's Gospel reading has a specific focus. The old Testament reading, especially those taken from Isaiah, are prophecies about the Messiah and messianic times.
