<u>Christmas Thank you:</u> I want to express my thanks for the many dinners, cards and gifts that I received over Christmas season. Thank you. You have been very generous. The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is held from January 18 to 25, each year. This eight day period (AKA an "octave")—first proposed by the Franciscan Fr. Paul Wattson in 1908—begins with the feast of the confession of St. Peter and ends with the feast of the conversion of St. Paul. By finding ways to pray together during this week, we join with all people around the world who are praying, reflecting, studying, and even eating and drinking together to celebrate and pray for Christian unity.


Ecumenism: is the effort to promote unity among all Christians. Today, the division among the Christians is a scandal to the 'one body of Christ' image. This means honest dialogue to better understand one another. The Canadian Bishops have prepared a wonderful and easy to read document to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Second Vatican Council's document on Ecumenism, Unitatis Redintegratio; the CCCB document is called 'A Church in Dialogue, Catholic Ecumenical Commitment. Please go online to get a copy or find some paper copies in the foyer.

Salt and Light Magazine available: we have 5 complimentary copies of their publication. The main articles are about Pope Paul VI, our pope from 1963 to 1978, guiding us through the Second Vatican Council. Wonderful articles on the Oct 2014 Synod on the family, including the closing remarks by Pope Francis. There are articles on the latest Canadian saints (April 2014), Marie of the Incarnation and Francois de Laval – a most interesting thing is that the usual requirement of miracles was waved in respect of the extraordinary life of holiness witnessed by these two saints.

Prince George Renewal Center: we have 2 complimentary copies of their Spring Program Brochure. Although many of us might not go to Prince George to attend the presentations, a look in the brochure can give us ideas to try. There are the standard topic presentations (Ecumenism, Reconciliation), and there are DVD based discussion groups (DVD by Fr.Ron Rolheiser and Fr.Richard Rohr), and the interesting Movies with Meaning series which features secular movies that have a strong Catholic Christian value message. Please feel free to look at the brochure, and I will be willing to do my best to have something similar here in St.Josephs.

ORDINARY TIME in the Church Calendar

Christmas Season is over. The Church calendar is now back to the Ordinary Time. Ordinary in the vocabulary of the church does not mean unimportant or not special. The season means the "ordered" life of the



church, the time when we live our lives neither in feasting, like in the season of Christmas and Easter, nor in penance, like in the season of Advent and Lent. But we live our lives in constant expectation of Christ's second coming.

Sundays of this season are the times when we gather to hear the word of God, reflect upon it, and receive Christ in the holy communion. Spiritually nourished, we continue to celebrate the love of God through our words and actions.

World Day of Migrants and Refugees

Week of Christian Unity - January 18-25, 2015

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity will be celebrated around the world, January 18-25, 2015. Drafted by a writing team in Brazil, and using the theme "Give me a drink" (John 4.7), the materials for the 2015 Week of Prayer invite a prayerful reflection on the meaning of water and sharing with "the other". In a letter last month to the Plenary Assembly of the Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity, Pope Francis wrote:

Spiritual ecumenism, which reaches a high point in the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, lives and develops through countless channels, which truly only the Lord sees, but which we, too, often have the joy of knowing: it is a worldwide network of prayerful moments which, at parish and international levels, spread the oxygen of the authentic ecumenical spirit through the body of the Church; a network of acts, which see us united and working together in so many works of charity; and it is also a sharing of prayer, of meditation and other texts which circulate on the web and can contribute to raising awareness, respect and mutual esteem.


