"We are the Catholic Community of St. Joseph's Parish, gathered as disciples of Jesus Christ to worship God, to serve others and to grow as loving members of God's family."



The Baptism of the Lord marks the end of our Christmas season. This feast day celebrates once again the revelation that Jesus is the Son of God. But this feast is also a bridge to the task to take this message to the whole world. In Mark 1:9 we read 'And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased." Here Jesus appears to be the only one who hears the proclamation. In Mark 9:7 we read 'and a voice came from the cloud: "This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to him!" Here the proclamation is heard by the disciples. Finally in Mark 15:39 we read 'And when the centurion, who stood there in front of Jesus, saw how he died,^[C] he said, "Surely this man was the Son of God!", and we know that the world has received the message.

Evangelization, the work of taking the message to the world, is what we are called to do. **Our homework this week** is to do something to show that we are committed to taking the message to the world. Possible ideas: wear a t-shirt with a religious slogan, put a cross on all your homework assignments, make the sign of the cross before eating any meal, especially in public, including the schools and work places.

FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

535 Jesus' public life begins with his baptism by John in the Jordan.²²⁸ John preaches "a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins" "Then Jesus appears." The Baptist hesitates, but Jesus insists and receives baptism. Then the Holy Spirit, in the form

of a dove, comes upon Jesus and a voice from heaven proclaims, "This is my beloved Son."²³¹ This is the manifestation ("Epiphany") of Jesus as Messiah of Israel and Son of God. 536 The baptism of Jesus is on his part the acceptance and inauguration of his mission as God's suffering Servant. He allows himself to be numbered among sinners; he is already "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world".²³²Already he is anticipating the "baptism" of his bloody death.²³³ Already he is coming to "fulfill all righteousness", that is, he is submitting himself entirely to his Father's will: out of love he consents to this baptism of death for the remission of our sins.²³⁴ The Father's voice responds to the Son's acceptance, proclaiming his entire delight in his Son.²³⁵ The Spirit whom Jesus possessed in fullness from his conception comes to "rest on him".²³⁶ Jesus will be the source of the Spirit for all mankind. At his baptism "the heavens were opened"²³⁷ - the heavens that Adam's sin had closed - and the waters were sanctified by the descent of Jesus and the Spirit, a prelude to the new creation.

537 Through Baptism the Christian is sacramentally assimilated to Jesus, who in his own baptism anticipates his death and resurrection. The Christian must enter into this mystery of humble self-abasement and repentance, go down into the water with Jesus in order to rise with him, be reborn of water and the Spirit so as to become the Father's beloved son in the Son and "walk in newness of life".²³⁸

Returning to Spirit. The Aboriginal Returning to Spirit Workshop is scheduled for January 26-30th, 2015. This workshop is designed for Aboriginal people who continue to experience the legacy of residential schools. The workshop benefits survivors, families of survivors, and anyone who wants to move beyond healing to reconciliation and discover the spirit of who they are.
