"We are the Catholic Community of St. Joseph's Parish, gathered as disciples of Jesus Christ to worship God, to serve others and to grow as loving members of God's family."




<u>RESTING in Lent:</u> Continuing with this theme, we draw attention to the instrumental music during the offertory which helps us to focus on the actions at the altar, to the simple recessional hymn, and to the efforts to move our conversations after mass out to the foyer.

Gospel theme: The Peace (and Restfulness) of Jesus is disturbed when he experiences that temple prayer has been replaced with temple commerce, and when faithfulness has been replaced by requests for proof of his authority. Restfulness is restored when we are faithful to prayer, as described in the fourth commandment: "Remember the Sabbath Day, and keep it holy". Restfulness is restored when we live lives faithfully believing in the power of the cross rather than joining the group who sees the cross as 'a stumbling block' (the opposite of powerful authority) or as 'foolishness' (the opposite of wisdom). Homework: pray 'Jesus help my busyness not to be an excuse to rest with you.'

Thank you to Sr.Jude, and to Fr.Jack and John Connolly: To help us begin our Lenten time, Sr.Jude gave a reflection on Feb 22 and Fr.Jack and John Connolly gave a mission on March1-2. We were challenged to allow God to transform us. Thank you to the presenters, and thank you to everyone who came out.

Stations of the Cross: one Lenten devotion: The early Christian pilgrims travelled to the Holy Land to visit the sites where lesus lived, suffered and died. And many who could not travel would listen to these pilgrims who would come back with inspiriational stories of faith and obedience. This led to a devotion that traced the footsteps of Jesus from his trial to his tomb, what we now call the Stations of the Cross. At the heart of this devotion is Jesus' obedience unto death, our sorrow for our sins, and God's abiding love for His children. This devotion can be prayed by an individual or by a group. Check the Friday schedule for when St. Joseph's will host the group recitation.

In all places and circumstances, Christians, with the help of their pastors, are called to hear the cry of the poor. This has been eloquently stated by the bishops of Brazil: "We wish to take up daily the joys and hopes, the difficulties and

sorrows of the Brazilian people, especially of those living in the barrios and the countryside – landless, homeless, lacking food and health care – to the detriment of their rights. Seeing their poverty, hearing their cries and knowing their sufferings, we are scandalized because we know that there is enough food for everyone and that hunger is the result of a poor distribution of goods and income. – Pope Francis, The Joy of the Gospel, 191.

DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE has been working with the Brazilian bishops for many years to respond to the cry of the poor. Your generosity helps fund our partnership with their Pastoral Land Commission, which works to support the rural poor through agricultural development and land reform. MAN'S CAPACITY FOR GOD (from the CCC)

II. WAYS OF COMING TO KNOW GOD (Continuation)

35 Man's faculties make him capable of coming to a knowledge of the existence of a personal God. But for man to be able to enter into real intimacy with him, God willed both to reveal himself to man and to give him the grace of being able to welcome this revelation in faith. The proofs of God's existence, however, can predispose one to faith and help one to see that faith is not opposed to reason.

III. THE KNOWLEDGE OF GOD ACCORDING TO THE CHURCH

36 "Our holy mother, the Church, holds and teaches that God, the first principle and last end of all things, can be known with certainty from the created world by the natural light of human reason."¹¹ Without this capacity, man would not be able to welcome God's revelation. Man has this capacity because he is created "in the image of God"
