PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

"We are the Catholic Community of St. Joseph's Parish, gathered as disciples of Jesus Christ to worship God, to serve others and to grow as loving members of God's family."



<u>RESTING in Lent:</u> At the end of the opening announcements, the Lector invites us to a few moments of prayerful silence; it is intended as a time to focus on the three instruments that shape our lives: ourselves, our neighbors, our God, and to prepare to be changed. From our lives, we push away what is distracting us and we focus on something we want; from our neighbors, we push away any obstacles and prepare to be open to what they might teach us; and with God, we push away any distractions and prepare for God to tell us something during the mass celebration either in scripture, in the ritual, or in the priest/presider. We do this resting the whole year through.

<u>Gospel theme:</u> The readings focus on God's love, a constant theme, but one that should never exhaust our attention. God's judgement comes only after a very long time of committed patience, and even when the judgement comes, the consequence is of limited duration precisely because God does not desire the downfall of any sinner, but rather that they turn to him and live. It is God's love that is the source of both the patience and the salvific goal for us humans. The question is 'are we willing to receive God's love so that it can effect changes in us'? Homework: ask a few people in your life how they love you, and reflect on how open you are to receiving their love.

<u>March 19</u> FEAST OF ST. JOSEPH, HUSBAND OF MARY Let us ask St. Joseph to intercede for us and for all families. Mass will be celebrated at the Bulkley Lodge @ I Iam. ALL ARE WELCOME. On March 20th, the school will lead the mass at 9am with St. Joseph as the theme.

When the Supreme Court struck down Canada's assisted suicide law, it gave Parliament one year to replace it. Though human reason is, strictly speaking, truly capable by its own natural power and light of attaining to a true and certain knowledge of the one personal God, who watches over and controls the world by his providence, and of the natural law written in our hearts by the Creator; yet there are many obstacles which prevent reason from the effective and fruitful use of this inborn faculty. For the truths that concern the relations between God and man wholly transcend the visible order of things, and, if they are translated into human action and influence it, they call for self-surrender and abnegation. The human mind, in its turn, is hampered in the attaining of such truths, not only by the impact of the senses and the imagination, but also by disordered appetites which are the consequences of original sin. So it happens that men in such matters easily persuade themselves that what they would not like to be true is false or at least doubtful.

38 This is why man stands in need of being enlightened by God's revelation, not only about those things that exceed his understanding, but also "about those religious and moral truths which of themselves are not beyond the grasp of human reason, so that even in the present condition of the human race, they can be known by all men with ease, with firm certainty and with no admixture of error".
