PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

"We are the Catholic Community of St. Joseph's Parish, gathered as disciples of Jesus Christ to worship God, to serve others and to grow as loving members of God's family."



Easter Season: the message of the resurrection of lesus Christ has to be shared - and the community responsible for spreading this message is the Church.

Church Models: Sacramental * Institutional * Herald *Community * Service * Discipleship

In the INSTITUTIONAL model of the Church, the emphasis is on the hierarchical community, for just as God shared authority with lesus, so lesus shares his authority with the Church. This model explains the hierarchy, the laws, and the structure of the Church as a visible community in the world. The strength of this model is that leadership assures identity, order and continuity such that the uncertain present is linked to a secure past. The weaknesses of this model are those of any institute: individual people can get lost, the structure can become the end and not the means to the end, critical thinking and/or ecumenical relations can be discouraged, and the laity and clergy are seen as divided.

3rd Sunday of Easter. "Peter addressed the people: 'The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our fathers (ancestors) has glorified his servant Jesus'. " We can break away and start something completely new or we can grow(develop) a new leaf on an existing plant - the Catholic Church uses the second principle. Remembering that the Sacramental model shares that our invisible God is everywhere, ready to burst out through visible signs like bread and water and oil, the Institutional model assures us that our understanding of God develops and grows but never completely starts ANEW. Scripturally, it would appear that Peter had a privileged position which the Catholic Church passes on in the position of the Pope. Historically, this has been challenged, and groups have set themselves equal to the Pope in authority.

<u>Catechism Corner (from the Catechism of the Catholic Church)</u> <u>GOD COMES TO MEET MAN (From the CCC)</u>

50 By natural reason man can know God with certainty, on the basis of his works. But there is another order of knowledge, which man cannot possibly arrive at by his own powers: the order of divine Revelation.¹ Through an utterly free decision, God has revealed himself and given himself to man. This he does by revealing the mystery, his plan of loving goodness, formed from all eternity in Christ, for the benefit of all men. God has fully revealed this plan by sending us his beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit.

ARTICLE 1 THE REVELATION OF GOD I. GOD REVEALS HIS "PLAN OF LOVING GOODNESS"

<u>51</u> "It pleased God, in his goodness and wisdom, to reveal himself and to make known the mystery of his will. His will was that men should have access to the Father, through Christ, the Word made flesh, in the Holy Spirit, and thus become sharers in the divine nature."²

52 God, who "dwells in unapproachable light", wants to communicate his own divine life to the men he freely created, in order to adopt them as his sons in his only-begotten Son.³ By revealing himself God wishes to make them capable of responding to him, and of knowing him and of loving him far beyond their own natural capacity.

53 The divine plan of Revelation is realized simultaneously "by deeds and words which are intrinsically bound up with each other"⁴ and shed light on each another. It involves a specific divine pedagogy: God communicates himself to man gradually. He prepares him to welcome by stages the supernatural Revelation that is to culminate in the person and mission of the incarnate Word, Jesus Christ.
