# Note from the Pastor

**THE PROPHET**: (1)Since all things start with God, (2)the prophet has to personally have this conviction.

In the Scriptures today, we find two references to this call for the prophet to trust God completely. In Corinthians 5:14, St.Paul writes "The love of God urges us on, because we are convinced that one has died for all." It was Paul's conviction that Jesus had died for all sinners that helped him overcome any of the struggles that came to him when he promoted Jesus. In the Gospel, Jesus says to his disciples after he was asked to calm the storm, "Why are you afraid. Have you STILL no faith?" It seems that the disciples were not yet ready to fully trust and be convinced that Jesus could do all things – they kept asking for proof. We will find ourselves somewhere between the total conviction of St.Paul and the wavering conviction of the disciples. And if we accept to being a disciple of Jesus, we will be moving towards this TOTAL CONVICTION.

Homework: Pray the words, 'Jesus, I believe, help my unbelief." Let us ask Jesus to help us overcome any unbelief that is in us, both unbelief about God or about our fathers (and mothers).

Rose Prince Pilgrimage, July 3,4,5 at Lejac (see bulletin board): In 1951 it was decided to relocate a few graves that were west of the Lejac Indian Residential School to another larger cemetery nearby. During the transfer the casket of a young woman named Rose Prince broke open. She had been buried two years earlier. The workers were amazed to find both Rose's body and clothing perfectly preserved. Other bodies were examined. All of them, some buried after Rose, were found to be decaying. When witnesses were called, including some Sisters, they found her body in perfect condition. She seemed transparent and looked as if she were sleeping. There was "just a tiny little smile on her face". A bouquet of withered flowers was on her chest.

Among Catholics such bodily in-corruption has a very special meaning. The church accepts this as a sign from God which witnesses to the life of great holiness. It is a miracle that reflects the victory of Christ over death and is echoed in the words of Scripture, "You will not allow your holy one to experience decay" (Acts 13:35). The discovery of Rose Prince's body in such a state reminded witnesses of the holy life this young First Nations woman lived and how such a quiet and humble life is a sign of the hidden grace of the mercy of God.

In an interview following the 2004 pilgrimage Bishop Gerald Wiesner noted that Rose Prince "was a rather ordinary person". But, at the same time he said, "she lived her human life fully and her faith life deeply in a rather extraordinary way. That is probably the greatest appeal she has."

He described the pilgrimage as "a really good opportunity for all people to come together and celebrate their faith."

## **ARTICLE 2**

### **II. THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN TRADITION AND SACRED SCRIPTURE**

## One common source. . .

80 "Sacred Tradition and Sacred Scripture, then, are bound closely together, and communicate one with the other. For both of them, flowing out from the same divine well-spring, come together in some fashion to form one thing, and move towards the same goal." Each of them makes present and fruitful in the Church the mystery of Christ, who promised to remain with his own "always, to the close of the age".

# ... two distinct modes of transmission

81 "Sacred Scripture is the speech of God as it is put down in writing under the breath of the Holy Spirit."

"And [Holy] Tradition transmits in its entirety the Word of God which has been entrusted to the apostles by Christ the Lord and the Holy Spirit. It transmits it to the successors of the apostles so that, enlightened by the Spirit of truth, they may faithfully preserve, expound and spread it abroad by their preaching."

82 As a result the Church, to whom the transmission and interpretation of Revelation is entrusted, "does not derive her certainty about all revealed truths from the holy Scriptures alone. Both Scripture and Tradition must be accepted and honored with equal sentiments of devotion and reverence."
