#### PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

"We are the Catholic Community of St. Joseph's Parish, gathered as disciples of Jesus Christ to worship God, to serve others and to grow as loving members of God's family."



**THE PROPHET:** (1)Since all things start with God, (2)the prophet has to personally believe this conviction and (3)then share this conviction in a world that endorses the opposite.

Did God create death? Did God create illness? If Jesus conquered death and illness, why does it still exist? From John 11:25-26 we read, "Whoever believes in me will live, EVEN THOUGH THEY DIE" followed by an apparent contradiction, "Whoever lives and believes in me will NEVER DIE.". In a nutshell we have Jesus affirming NATURAL DEATH as the necessary reality of the limits of our earthly existence, and UNNATURAL DEATH as the reality of humanity's resistance to God. To conquer death and illness, scripture records Jesus was 'aware that power had gone out of him.' Jesus uses his power to bring life.

The context in which Jesus finds himself is filled with people who doubt. Interesting how the faith of the woman with the bleeding problem ('if I just touch his clothes, I will be clean') is contrasted with the doubt of the disciples ('Jesus, how can you ask who touched you?'). And the crowd 'laughed at' Jesus when he said the child was 'sleeping.' This is the context of the PROPHET today, sharing a message of life in an atmosphere of doubt and ridicule.

Homework: Pray the words, 'Jesus, I believe, help my unbelief." Let us ask Jesus to help us overcome doubt and ridicule in our faith life.

Thank you to Melissa Cachia for her dedicated service in the Church, specific mention to her commitment to the Youth Group and to Scripture/Faith Studies. We sendsour prayers with her as she accepts her new role with Catholic Christian Outreach at the University of Victoria.

Rose Prince Pilgrimage, July 3,4,5 at Lejac (see bulletin board): The incorrupt body of Rose Prince, buried for two years and discovered by accident when the body was being prepared to be moved to a new cemetery, started a search into the life of this First Nations woman, a student and a resident at the the Lejac Residential school. Her life is remembered in this diocesan pilgrimage each year. Resources have been secured to formally record her life for the purposes of advancing her Cause for Sainthood. The schedule of the pilgrimage is on the bulletin board; any part that you can attend would be beneficial.

**CAMP MORICE:** wonderful opportunities for children and for families to grow in their faith this summer. See bulletin board for programs. In particular, each parish in the Diocese has been challenged to send youth to the IGNITE weekend. The group FaceToFace Ministries which runs IGNITE was at the Diocesan Youth Conference in May 2014. Let us help promote this opportunity for our Youth to get together and grow in their faith.

**'Laudato Si' Praised Be** Development and Peace welcomes this week's release of Pope Francis' encyclical Laudato Si, which will be focused on the environment and care for creation. Published on June 18th, the encyclical addresses climate change as a social injustice that requires urgent action. We are called on to recognize that,

according to Pope Francis, "respect for creation, then, is a requirement of our faith: the 'garden' in which we live is not entrusted to us to be exploited, but rather to be cultivated and tended with respect." 

# II. THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN TRADITION AND SACRED SCRIPTURE

# Apostolic Tradition and ecclesial traditions

83 The Tradition here in question comes from the apostles and hands on what they received from Jesus' teaching and example and what they learned from the Holy Spirit. The first generation of Christians did not yet have a written New Testament, and the New Testament itself demonstrates the process of living Tradition.

Tradition is to be distinguished from the various theological, disciplinary, liturgical or devotional traditions, born in the local churches over time. These are the particular forms, adapted to different places and times, in which the great Tradition is expressed. In the light of Tradition, these traditions can be retained, modified or even abandoned under the guidance of the Church's Magisterium.

# III. THE INTERPRETATION OF THE HERITAGE OF FAITH

### The heritage of faith entrusted to the whole of the Church

**84** The apostles entrusted the "Sacred deposit" of the faith (the *depositum fidei*), contained in Sacred Scripture and Tradition, to the whole of the Church. "By adhering to [this heritage] the entire holy people, united to its pastors, remains always faithful to the teaching of the apostles, to the brotherhood, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. So, in maintaining, practicing and professing the faith that has been handed on, there should be a remarkable harmony between the bishops and the faithful."
