### PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

"We are the Catholic Community of St. Joseph's Parish, gathered as disciples of Jesus Christ to worship God, to serve others and to grow as loving members of God's family."



Jesus asks us, 'Who do you say I am?': Our God in the first reading is a God that heals us; in the responsorial Psalm, He walks with us; in the letter of James, He demands action and not just words. Jesus refuses to assume that we have heard God revealing Himself throughout history, hence he wants us to declare what we believe, 'Who do you say I am?' The situation is made all the more exciting because Jesus asks this question of his disciples in the area of Caesarea Philippi, an area full of 'distracting gods'. There was the ancient tradition of worshipping Baal; there was a cave up on a hill where it was believed that the Greek god Pam was born; farther up the hill was a gleaming white temple honoring the godhead of Caesar, the Roman Emperor. And Jesus is just a 'homeless carpenter from an unimportant area of Galilee'. The courage and confidence of Jesus is show-stopping.

Since Scripture does not record the voice of Jesus, but only his words, we are free to imagine how Jesus said these words. Did he say them angrily – implying that we are ignorant? Did he say them with exhaustion – implying that he had tried his best? <u>Homework:</u> imagine how Jesus said these words, and reflect on why you think so. Further homework: can you imagine how Jesus would say the words with GRATITUDE, TRUST, and GENEROSITY – the principles of stewardship and our diocesan appeal.

THE CANON OF SCRIPTURE

V. SACRED SCRIPTURE IN THE LIFE OF THE CHURCH

**131** "And such is the force and power of the Word of God that it can serve the Church as her support and vigor, and the children of the Church as strength for their faith, food for the soul, and a pure and lasting fount of spiritual life."<sup>109</sup> Hence "access to Sacred Scripture ought to be open wide to the Christian faithful."

**<u>132</u>** "Therefore, the study of the sacred page should be the very soul of sacred theology. The ministry of the Word, too - pastoral preaching, catechetics and all forms of Christian instruction, among which the liturgical homily should hold pride of place - is healthily nourished and thrives in holiness through the Word of Scripture."

**133** The Church "forcefully and specifically exhorts all the Christian faithful. . . to learn the surpassing knowledge of Jesus Christ, by frequent reading of the divine Scriptures. Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ.
