### PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

"We are the Catholic Community of St. Joseph's Parish, gathered as disciples of Jesus Christ to worship God, to serve others and to grow as loving members of God's family."



What God has joined, we must not divide. This divine thought carries with it two parts: on the part of God, His work is to unite and bring together; on the part of humans, our work is to preserve the unity. Moses had written a Hebrew law that allowed divorce; with empathy for people who find themselves in relationships that are very difficult, our empathy could lead us to agree with Moses and allow for relationships to dissolve. But the answer that Jesus gives would imply that our empathy would be misplaced. Not only is divorce not a part of God's plan, but the root of divorce is 'hardness of heart'. I hope no one is surprised. Our hardness of heart can turn our friend into our enemy, our helpmate into our object of revenge, our God into a god. Throughout his ministry Jesus demonstrated that the work of God to unite is achieved by a softness of heart; Jesus forgave, lifted up, healed, accompanied, fed, cried for, taught, waited patiently, hung on the cross ....

<u>Homework:</u> pray 'Jesus meek and humble of heart, make my heart like unto thine.

**Catechism Corner** (from the Catechism of the Catholic Church) Article 3

#### **CHAPTER THREE** MAN'S RESPONSE TO GOD

146 Abraham thus fulfills the definition of faith in Hebrews 11:1: "Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen": "Abraham believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness." Because he was "strong in his faith", Abraham became the "father of all who believe".

147 The Old Testament is rich in witnesses to this faith. The Letter to the Hebrews proclaims its eulogy of the exemplary faith of the ancestors who "received divine approval". Yet "God had foreseen something better for us": the grace of believing in his Son Jesus, "the pioneer and perfecter of our faith".

## Mary - "Blessed is she who believed"

148 The Virgin Mary most perfectly embodies the obedience of faith. By faith Mary welcomes the tidings and promise brought by the angel Gabriel, believing that "with God nothing will be impossible" and so giving her assent: "Behold I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be [done] to me according to your word." Elizabeth greeted her: "Blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her from the Lord." It is for this faith that all generations have called Mary blessed.

149 Throughout her life and until her last ordeal when Jesus her son died on the cross, Mary's faith never wavered. She never ceased to believe in the fulfillment of God's word. And so the Church venerates in Mary the purest realization of faith.
