PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

"We are the Catholic Community of St. Joseph's Parish, gathered as disciples of Jesus Christ to worship God, to serve others and to grow as loving members of God's family."

ALL SAINTS (Nov 01) and ALL SOULS(Nov 02): The resurrection of Jesus from the grave and the promise that Jesus made to the thief on the cross (“You will be with me in paradise” - Lk 23:43) contribute to our creedal statement ‘I believe in the resurrection of the body and life everlasting.’ **On All Saints Day** we honour all of the saints of the Church, known and unknown. We reflect on the nature of sainthood: a holy life, an exemplary example, and an inspiring witness of the men and woman of every time and place. **On All Souls Day** we honour our deceased brothers and sisters whose souls in purgatory are undergoing their final purification and are benefitted by our prayers for them.

Homework: Prayer: Happy are those who have died in the Lord. Let them rest from their labours for their good deeds go with them. (Revelation 14:13) or Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

Month of NOVEMBER: Please mark you calendars for November 1st and the blessing of graves: Houston 1pm, Telkwa 3pm, Smithers 4pm. On November 2 come and pray for your deceased loved ones; three masses available 9am, 12:10pm, and 6:15pm. Permission is granted to receive Holy Communion twice on this day. Throughout the month of November, all of the names in our Book of Remembrance will be remembered during holy mass.

Periodically I am going to include a reflection that I find challenging and worthy of careful thought. **Co-workers of the Truth, reflections from Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI:** “The so-called Didache of the apostles, a book that dates from about 90 or 100 ad., records a tradition that had long been accepted as a matter of course: “Assemble together on the Lord’s Day, break bread, and give thanks, having first confessed your sins so that your offering will be pure” (Did 14:1). We can be certain of this, then: it is not the role of the Church or of any individual Christian to decide whether or when we should celebrate the divine liturgy or what we should decide to do with our Sunday. Someone may object: But I dislike the bad air in the church and the worn-out hymns. It bothers me to kneel crowded together with all kinds of people whom I do not know and to hear the priest recite prayers that I cannot understand. I prefer to go up into the mountains, into the woods, or on the water, and I am more pious in God’s free nature than in a congregation that has nothing to offer me. In reply one might say: It cannot be that we choose for ourselves whether or how we shall worship God: what is important is that we respond to him in the place where he gives himself to us. We cannot decide on our own terms where God is to meet us, and we should not strive to reach him by our own efforts. He can come to us and let us find him wherever he chooses. What matters is not just some pious feeling of ours that relegates religion to the realm of the non-obligatory and private but the obedience that hears God’s call and accepts it. The Lord does not want our private feelings; he wants to form us into a community and to build the new community of the Church on faith. The body must share in the divine worship as must the community with its hardships and discomforts. That is why it is false to ask: “What do I get out of this?””

DEVELOPMENT & PEACE

Climate change is an issue of justice!

The most poor and vulnerable in the Global South suffer the most from the impacts of climate change, yet they are the ones who contribute the least to the carbon emissions that are warming the planet. Did you know that Canada has carbon emissions that are 150 times higher per capita than Ethiopia, one of the countries in the world that suffers the

most from drought conditions exacerbated by climate change? Pope Francis reminds us of our responsibility to act in his encyclical *Laudato Si*: “The pace of consumption, waste and environmental change has so stretched the planet’s capacity that our contemporary lifestyle, unsustainable as it is, can only precipitate catastrophes, such as those which even now periodically occur in different areas of the world. The effects of this imbalance can only be reduced by our decisive action, here and now.” **Take part in Development and Peace’s campaign Create a Climate of Change to do your part!**

Visiting a Church or an Oratory on All Soul’s Day

A plenary (“full”) indulgence, which is applicable only to the souls in Purgatory, is granted to the Christian faithful who devoutly visit a church or an oratory on All Souls Day, November 2.

Requirements for Obtaining a Plenary Indulgence on All Souls Day Visit a church and pray one “Our Father” and the “Apostles Creed” for the souls in Purgatory. Pray one “Our Father” and one “Hail Mary” for the Holy Father’s intentions (as designated by the Holy Father each month). Worthily receive Holy Communion (ideally on the same day if you can get to Mass). Make a sacramental confession within 20 days of All Souls Day.

You can acquire one plenary indulgence a day. A partial indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, can be obtained when saying the “**Eternal rest ...**” prayer. Eternal rest grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen. From the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC)

Article 3: CHAPTER THREE

Faith and understanding

158 "Faith seeks understanding": it is intrinsic to faith that a believer desires to know better the One in whom he has put his faith, and to understand better what He has revealed; a more penetrating knowledge will in turn call forth a greater faith, increasingly set afire by love. The grace of faith opens "the eyes of your hearts" to a lively understanding of the contents of Revelation: that is, of the totality of God's plan and the mysteries of faith, of their connection with each other and with Christ, the center of the revealed mystery. "The same Holy Spirit constantly perfects faith by his gifts, so that Revelation may be more and more profoundly understood." In the words of St. Augustine, "I believe, in order to understand; and I understand, the better to believe."

159 *Faith and science*: "Though faith is above reason, there can never be any real discrepancy between faith and reason. Since the same God who reveals mysteries and infuses faith has bestowed the light of reason on the human mind, God cannot deny himself, nor can truth ever contradict truth." "Consequently, methodical research in all branches of knowledge, provided it is carried out in a truly scientific manner and does not override moral laws, can never conflict with the faith, because the things of the world and the things of faith derive from the same God. The humble and persevering investigator of the secrets of nature is being led, as it were, by the hand of God in spite of himself, for it is God, the conserver of all things, who made them what they are."
