PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

"We are the Catholic Community of St. Joseph's Parish, gathered as disciples of Jesus Christ to worship God, to serve others and to grow as loving members of God's family."



WATCH AND PRAY: We begin our church year by looking forward, and we take the reality of the first coming of Christ 2000 years ago and use it to look forward to his second coming at a time no one knows. The posture of all of creation is one of looking forward. We look forward 'watching' – this reminds us that we have an active part to play in God saving us, that we are no puppets or programed computers, but that we have personal will to make decisions for the coming of God into our lives. We look forward 'praying' – here we acknowledge that our eternal future belongs to God, and the way we belong to that eternal future is by developing a life of conversation (prayer) with God. We look forward 'hoping' - as we remember the promises God made to us at our baptism of this eternal life, Advent is a time where we practice 'hope' that God is faithful to all his promises.

<u>Homework:</u> Commit to 5 minutes of prayer every day of Advent; eg read the gospel of the day.

Word Among Us publication: The parish is offering this booklet free of charge. It covers the Advent season. I encourage families to make a commitment to read all or parts of the readings for each day. Incorporate the readings as part of a commitment to 5 minutes of daily prayer.

Year of Mercy and Reconciliation Service: Review the information in the bulletin on the Year of Mercy asked for by Pope Francis. Our first activities are: (1)Sunday, Dec 06, examination of conscience during mass using the Works of Mercy; (2)Monday, Dec 07, opportunities for reconciliation (see times posted); (3)Monday, Dec 07, 7pm, join Knights of Columbus sponsored Hour of Prayer for the family; (4) Tuesday, Dec 08, our mass joins Pope Francis in starting this Year of Mercy.

Pope Saint John Paul II: <u>Crossing the Threshold of Hope</u>: written 16 years into being Pope, this personally written book describes the hope our faith engenders.

Wicks, <u>Crossing the Desert</u>, referring to the wisdom of the desert writers, this is a book for those who want to transform their lives.

Green, <u>Come Down Zacchaeus</u>, a book on the spirituality of the laity, written for both the spiritual and the theological seeker of understanding.

Rolheiser, <u>The Restless Heart</u>, explores loneliness. A wonderful book for Advent.

<u>ADVENT RECONCILIATION</u>: As a community, let us do this together as we celebrate Advent Reconciliation on the 7th of December from 3PM-4:30PM; 5:30-7PM and 8PM onwards. **May we find God's mercy and consolation as we approach him in the** Sacrament of Confession and create a sacred place for him in our lives

Key points about the upcoming Holy Year of Mercy

To convene the Jubilee, the Pope delivered a so-called bull. It is entitled **"Misericordie Vultus,"** or **"The Face of Mercy."** The text includes 25 points that the Pope believes are important for the upcoming year.

God forgives with tenderness and compassion, the Pope said. However, Christians should also be forgiving to be credible. And so the motto of the Jubilee will be "Merciful like the Father."

"The time has come for the Church to take up the joyful call to mercy once more. It is time to return to the basics and to bear the weaknesses and struggles of our brothers and sisters. Mercy is the force that reawakens us to new life and instills in us the courage to look to the future with hope."

The Jubilee will begin on December 8th and ends on November 20, 2016. Specific points include:

- It invites Catholics to rediscover works of mercy.
- It suggests that the Sacrament of Confession will be paramount.
- The Pope will appoint priests in every diocese to be "convincing preachers of mercy," and they will forgive particularly grave sins without having to ask permission from the Vatican. For example, they will have the authority to pardon sacrilege against the Eucharist.
- Gangmembers will be asked to convert.
- It proposes dialogue with Jews and Muslims to avoid contempt or discrimination.

The Pope explained that the Jubilee is an opportunity for every person and not simply an institutional event.

POPE FRANCIS

"Why a Jubilee of Mercy today? Simply because the Church, in this time of great historical change, is called to offer more evident signs of God's presence and closeness. This is not the time to be distracted."

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC)

CHAPTER THREE MAN'S RESPONSE TO GOD ARTICLE 2 WE BELIEVE

I. "LORD, LOOK UPON THE FAITH OF YOUR CHURCH"

168 It is the Church that believes first, and so bears. nourishes and sustains my faith. Everywhere, it is the Church that first confesses the Lord: "Throughout the world the holy Church acclaims you", as we sing in the hymn "Te Deum"; with her and in her, we are won over and brought to confess: "I believe", "We believe". It is through the Church that we receive faith and new life in Christ by Baptism. In the Rituale Romanum, the minister of Baptism asks the catechumen: "What do you ask of God's Church?" And the answer is: "Faith." "What does faith offer you?" "Eternal life."

169 Salvation comes from God alone; but because we receive the life of faith through the Church, she is our mother: "We believe the Church as the mother of our new birth, and not in the Church as if she were the author of our salvation."Because she is our mother, she is also our teacher in the faith.
