Advent brings signs of hope: On this Second Sunday of Advent, we hear more promises of hope. Hope is proclaimed to the exiled people longing to return to Jerusalem, to the Philippians from the imprisoned Paul, to those caught in political turmoil during Jesus' lifetime. And we hear voices all around us yearning for hope. Pope Francis has called for this Year of Mercy to be a time for hope for all of us. Our hearts are open to new possibilities. Reconciliation is a sacrament rooted in hope that relationships be healed and strengthened, relationships with God, self, and others. **Homework:** Take a moment to prepare for reconciliation. Use the enclosed examination.

Description of the logo for the Jubilee Year of Mercy

Prayer card: The motto *Merciful Like the Father* serves as an invitation to follow the merciful example of the Father who asks us not to judge or condemn but to forgive and to give love and forgiveness without measure (Lk 6:37-38). The logo expresses the profound way in which the Good Shepherd touches the flesh of humanity and does so with a love with the power to change one's life. One particular feature worthy of note is that while the Good Shepherd, in his great mercy, takes humanity upon himself, his eyes are merged with those of man. Christ sees with the eyes of Adam, and Adam with the eyes of Christ. Every person discovers in Christ, the new Adam, one's own humanity and the future that lies ahead, contemplating, in his gaze, the love of the Father.

Advent Reconcilation times: This Monday there are numerous times available to receive the sacrament of reconciliation: 3:00-4:30, 5:30-7:00, and 8:00pm onwards. Aids to help prepare for the sacrament are available in this bulletin. The church will have an atmosphere of prayer and quiet reflection. I encourage everyone to take a few minutes in the church to help prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ at Christmas, and if you want to, I will be available for the sacrament. I personally go to the sacrament for three reasons: (1)grace is given, (2)humbleness is practiced, (3) and I discover who I am and who I am called to be.

Generosity is giving and sharing. It is giving freely because you want to, not with the idea of receiving a reward or gift in return. Giving without thought of what is owed in return is a blessing for both the giver and the receiver. Christmas we remember that God sent his Son to be among us. This was a gift of love for us.

CONCERT DAY- in the gym this year!!

The concert will be on December 17th with a show in the morning at 10:30 and a show in the evening at 6:30. We encourage some of you to consider the morning performance, if possible, because the evening performance is very full. Please feel free to invite grandparents, aunts, uncles and friends to the morning show. For the evening performance, children should report to their classrooms by 6:15 PROMPTLY to ensure enough time to dress in their costumes so the performance can begin on time. Please let your child's teacher know if he/she won't be here for either performance.

We are asking everyone to be thoughtful and respectful of the school. Please do not bring in beverages, gum, or food. Cell phones must to be turned off for the performance.

HERE ARE A FEW SAFETY CONCERNS THAT WE HAVE SO PLEASE READ AND FOLLOW:

BEFORE THE CONCERT: To ensure safe supervision of all children, we ask that students (except the grade 7s who are the main actors) not be brought to the school before 6 pm. We will open the doors at 6:00 pm and students will wait in the foyer with a supervisor until their classroom teacher comes to get them. Teachers will be arriving at 6:00 to pick

up any foyer students and then unlock the classrooms. <u>AFTER THE CONCERT</u>: we ask that members of the audience remain in their seats for five minutes after the show is over to allow the students to go back to their classrooms and pick up their things. If you do go down to your child's class, could you please remove your footwear in the student foyer to keep the hallways and classrooms clean. Outdoor shoes can be worn in the gym. Young children should be accompanied in the parking lot and drivers are asked to drive very slowly. Thank you for your cooperation with these matters.

CHAPTER THREE MAN'S RESPONSE TO GOD ARTICLE 2 WE BELIEVE

II. THE LANGUAGE OF FAITH

170 We do not believe in formulas, but in those realities they express, which faith allows us to touch. "The believer's act [of faith] does not terminate in the propositions, but in the realities [which they express]." All the same, we do approach these realities with the help of formulations of the faith which permit us to express the faith and to hand it on, to celebrate it in community, to assimilate and live on it more and more.

171 The Church, "the pillar and bulwark of the truth", faithfully guards "the faith which was once for all delivered to the saints". She guards the memory of Christ's words; it is she who from generation to generation hands on the apostles' confession of faith. As a mother who teaches her children to speak and so to understand and communicate, the Church our Mother teaches us the language of faith in order to introduce us to the understanding and the life of faith.
