PASTOR'S NOTE

Advent's promise brings rejoicing: Take heart! Rejoice! God is near! Live faithfully and without anxiety. Today's words are addressed to people in difficult situations, in different times and places. The words are for us, too. God has already come in Jesus, but we still have expectations of something more. In the midst of that, the message to us is to stand firm and rejoice in what is now.

<u>Homework:</u> Take one minute 3 times in one day (wake up, noon, and bed-time), and each time think of one different thing that makes you rejoice.

Holy Mother Church and not Holy girlfriend Church:

We don't get to hold out for the green-eyed redhead of our self-centered fantasies. VIRTUE FOR DECEMBER: Generosity

Generosity is being aware that there is plenty for everyone. God is abundance. You can choose to give what you have. It is one of the best ways to show joy and friendship. It feels good to give freely, just for the sake of giving. It is part of God's circle of love.

CONCERT DAY- in the gym this year!!

The concert will be on December 17th with a show in the morning at 10:30 and a show in the evening at 6:30. We encourage some of you to consider the morning performance, if possible, because the evening performance is very full. Please feel free to invite grandparents, aunts, uncles and friends to the morning show. For the evening performance, children should report to their <u>classrooms</u> by 6:15 PROMPTLY to ensure enough time to dress in their costumes so the performance can begin on time. Please let your child's teacher know if he/she won't be here for either

We are asking everyone to be thoughtful and respectful of the school. Please do not bring in beverages, gum, or food. Cell phones must to be turned off for the performance.

HERE ARE A FEW SAFETY CONCERNS THAT WE HAVE SO PLEASE READ AND FOLLOW:

BEFORE THE CONCERT: To ensure safe supervision of all children, we ask that students (except the grade 7s who are the main actors) not be brought to the school before 6 pm. We will open the doors at 6:00 pm and students will wait in the foyer with a supervisor until their classroom teacher comes to get them. Teachers will be arriving at 6:00 to pick up any foyer students and then unlock the classrooms.

AFTER THE CONCERT: we ask that members of the audience remain in their seats for five minutes after the show is over to allow the students to go back to their classrooms and pick up their things. If you do go down to your child's class, could you please remove your footwear in the student foyer to keep the hallways and classrooms clean. Outdoor shoes can be worn in the gym. Young children should be accompanied in the parking lot and drivers are asked to drive very slowly. Thank you for your cooperation with these matters.

NEEDED: REAL TREES (ASAP)

Our Christmas pageant set would be greatly enhanced by having some real evergreens on stage. Are you able to bring back a few extra Christmas trees from your foray into the forest for a Christmas tree? If so, we're looking for 5 or 6 trees, 7 to 9 feet tall. From the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC)

CHAPTER THREE MAN'S RESPONSE TO GOD ARTICLE 2 WE BELIEVE

III. ONLY ONE FAITH

172 Through the centuries, in so many languages, cultures, peoples and nations, the Church has constantly confessed this one faith, received from the one Lord, transmitted by one Baptism, and grounded in the conviction that all people have only one God and Father. St. Irenaeus of Lyons, a witness of this faith, declared:

173 "Indeed, the Church, though scattered throughout the whole world, even to the ends of the earth, having received the faith from the apostles and their disciples... guards [this preaching and faith] with care, as dwelling in but a single house, and similarly believes as if having but one soul and a single heart, and preaches, teaches and hands on this faith with a unanimous voice, as if possessing only one mouth."
