

PASTOR'S NOTE

Advent: let us praise the good deeds done:

My friends, hope is incredibly powerful, often something very simple and bubbles up in the reality of daily life. Today it is written small in the visit of a young pregnant Mary to her older cousin, Elizabeth. Mary brings Christ to another person in that simple gesture, and it's more than enough for Elizabeth to offer praise. Jealousy can prevent us from speaking praise of other people's good deeds. But from God who speaks of Jesus ('You are my beloved Son') and continued in the biblical characters such as Elizabeth speaking of Mary ('Blessed are you among women'), down to us today, we are called not to be jealous but to praise the good things that happen to others. Homework: Think of three people who have something that you would want (not necessarily need) and pray a Glory Be for their good fortune and blessing.

Thank you to Volunteers: I can never say thank you enough to the volunteers in the Church. Too many times, tasks are found done without a request from me or a peep from them. So many times I am given a gentle reminder of announcing some gathering, but the organization of the gathering is done by others. I am deeply appreciative of all the volunteers.

Welcoming people: Please join me in welcoming people to our Christmas celebrations and be sure to help them feel comfortable.

Octave to Christmas December 17-23: The 'O Antiphons' are composed of a title for Christ and a corresponding petition beneficial for our conversion and salvation.

December 20: O Key of David, opening the gates of God's eternal Kingdom: come and free the prisoners of darkness. Reflect on asking for sight to see beyond the passing things of this world to the things that last forever.

December 21: O Rising Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death. Reflect on the beauty of each morning's light, and the beauty of all creation.

December 22: O King of nations and keystone of the Church: come and save humankind, whom you formed from the dust! Reflect on praying for leaders of nations to work for justice.

December 23: O Emmanuel, our King and Giver of Law: come to save us, Lord our God! With Christmas two days away, share with someone what you are hoping for this Christmas.

What does it mean for descendants of residential school staff to reconcile with Canadian history? To explore this question, Caroline Crocker, a graduate student at the University of Victoria, is reaching out to other Canadians like herself - people whose parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles or other relatives worked in the Indian Residential School System - to ask them to join a focus group on Saturday, January 30, 2016 to discuss the topic. Caroline's research project is on reconciliation (improving relationships and healing) in Canada between Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people, specifically in regards to the Indian Residential School system.
