Pastor's Note:

#### Feast of the Holy Family: to be Known and Unknown

to them: Today's readings give us 2,000-year-old guidelines for living together in family. We hear that families take work: They require compassion, kindness, patience and above all, love. Families come in every configuration, and they are often imperfect. But they provide the environment for us to become who we are called to be. People are stretched, often painfully, in the process. It's good to know that Jesus' family was really no different. That it was unknown to Mary and Joseph that Jesus remained in Jerusalem, provided on the physical level the experience of knowing what it feels like to loose someone you love, and provided on the spiritual level the experience of being baffled by the mystery of life. <a href="Homework: How can Joseph">Homework: How can Joseph, Mary and Jesus be models for fathers, mothers, and children?</a>

The Knights of Columbus have a yearly Family Hour of Prayer event. We had this event on December 07. It contained some reflections given by our Popes which I share with you.

Pope Francis: **family with open doors.** "God came into the world in a family. And he could do this because that family was a family with a heart open to love, a family whose doors were open. We can think of Mary, a young woman. She couldn't believe it: "How can this be?" But once it was explained to her, she obeyed. We think of Joseph, full of dreams for making a home; then along comes this surprise that he doesn't understand. He accepts, he obeys. And in the loving obedience of this woman, Mary, and this man, Joseph, we have a family into which God comes. God always knocks on the doors of our hearts. " (World Meeting of Families Festival of Families September 26, 2015 (Philadelphia))

St. John Paul II: **family is the first church**. It is the family that reveals a specific image of the Church. "All members of the family, each according to his or her own gift, have the grace and responsibility of building, day by day, the communion of persons, making the family "a school of deeper humanity": this happens where there is care and love for the little ones, the sick, the aged; where there is mutual service every day (Familiaris Consortio, 21)

#### **ATTENTION FORMER FRONTIER APOSTLES**

What does it mean for descendants of residential school staff to reconcile with Canadian history? To explore this question, Caroline Crocker, a graduate student at the University of Victoria, is reaching out to other Canadians like herself - people whose parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles or other relatives worked in the Indian Residential School System - to ask them to join a focus group on Saturday, January 30, 2016 to discuss the topic. Caroline's research project is on reconciliation (improving relationships and healing) in Canada between Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people, specifically in regards to the Indian Residential School system. > From the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) CHAPTER THREE: MAN'S RESPONSE TO GOD ARTICLE 2 WE BELIEVE: IN BRIEF

**176** Faith is a personal adherence of the whole man to God who reveals himself. It involves an assent of the intellect and will to the self-revelation God has made through his deeds and words.

177 "To believe" has thus a twofold reference: to the person, and to the truth: to the truth, by trust in the person who bears witness to it.

178 We must believe in no one but God: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

179 Faith is a supernatural gift from God. In order to believe, man needs the interior helps of the Holy Spirit.

180 "Believing" is a human act, conscious and free, corresponding to the dignity of the human person.

181 "Believing" is an ecclesial act. The Church's faith precedes, engenders, supports and nourishes our faith. The Church is the mother of all believers. "No one can have God as Father who does not have the Church as Mother" (St. Cyprian, De unit. 6: PL

**182** We believe all "that which is contained in the word of God. written or handed down, and which the Church proposes for belief as divinely revealed" (Paul VI, CPG § 20).

183 Faith is necessary for salvation. The Lord himself affirms: "He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned" (Mk 16:16).

184 "Faith is a foretaste of the knowledge that will make us blessed in the life to come" (St. Thomas Aquinas. Comp. theol. 1, 2).
