#### PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

"We are the Catholic Community of St. Joseph's Parish, gathered as disciples of Jesus Christ to worship God, to serve others and to grow as loving members of God's family."



One gift, One Spirit: putting our gifts at the service of **Jesus' ministry.** The Gospel today is the well-known story of the wedding feast at Cana. John tells us that this sign of Jesus' power took place at the beginning of his ministry, in the context of a familiar life celebration. Jesus' ministry — from the very start — occurred in real life, addressing real-life concerns. And he continues to enter into our real lives as he offers himself to us in so many ways, especially in the bread and wine of the Eucharist. He generously provides what we need to exercise our own gifts for the building of the ONE KINGDOM OF GOD. Isaiah in the first reading looks to a invigorated and revived Jerusalem after the time of exile, and Paul in the letter to the Corinthians reminds us that there is only ONE SPIRIT that works for this building up, and we have it. **Homework:** memorize the 7 gifts of the spirit: wisdom, understanding, counsel, knowledge, fortitude, piety, fear of the Lord (wonder).

Themes: Mercy, Refugee, Religious Life, Unity (Ecumenism) and MUSICAL SELECTIONS: for the next four weeks we will be exploring and celebrating these themes with a concentration on the hymns that we sing. The hymns are powerful ways where the message of each Sunday is supported and strengthened. For example, the hymn Gather Us In has the following references: (1)for Unity –'Gather us in, all people together; (2) for Mercy 'Give us a heart so meek and so lowly' and for Religious Life -'Give us the courage to enter the song.; (3) for Refugees - 'See in this space our fears and our dreamngs'. Over these same four weeks we will be encouraging people to add their voices in song. We have all been to celebrations where no one is participating, and the atmosphere appears dead. We have also been to celebrations where everyone is adding their part, even if it's a soft voice, and the result is overwhelming alive. Over the next four weeks our hope is to encourage more musical participation with the goal of fuller (not necessarily louder) celebrations.

**Catholic Education Week:** just ended, let us pray for the good work of evangelization in our schools.

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity: just beginning, let us pray for the spirit to unit Christians into the one body of Christ.

#### **CATHOLIC EDUCATION WEEK-January 11-15**

We are blessed to have a Catholic School in Smithers. It was built by volunteers with donated materials and money and Department of Indian Affairs funds. It opened in 1958. Well into the 1970s the school was staffed by nuns, brothers, and young, volunteer "frontier apostles" from the United Kingdom and Eastern Canada. Also in the late 1970s, most of our many Catholic students from Moricetown moved to the Moricetown School when it opened. Many other big and small changes have happened throughout the years and here we are: one of eight schools in the Prince George diocese and of 79 in B.C. Our students are part of the over 21,000 students enrolled in Catholic Schools across the province.

# Proclaim Jesus with Loving Hearts

This year's (2015-2016) theme is **Proclaim Jesus with Loving Hearts**. Our goal as Catholic schools is to participate in the Church's evangelizating mission of bringing the Gospel to all people. Our schools are places for evangelization and as ecclesiastical institutions, they are "the privileged environment in which Christian education is carried out."

Activities this week included learning about Thomas Merton, Mother Theresa, Rose Prince, and George Vanier; doing Random Acts of Kindness Day; a walk around the school grounds followed by homemade muffins and hot chocolate prepared by the staff; and PJs and slippers Day (and God rested on the seventh day); the week ended with the recitation in song of the Our Father in the school hallway and celebration of mass.

# From the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) SECTION TWO THE PROFESSION OF THE CHRISTIAN FAITH THE CREEDS

**196** Our presentation of the faith will follow the Apostles' Creed, which constitutes, as it were, "the oldest Roman catechism". The presentation will be completed however by constant references to the Nicene Creed, which is often more explicit and more detailed.

197 As on the day of our Baptism, when our whole life was entrusted to the "standard of teaching", 14 let us embrace the Creed of our life-giving faith. To say the Credo with faith is to enter into communion with God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and also with the whole Church which transmits the faith to us and in whose midst we believe:

# PART ONE THE PROFESSION OF FAITH SECTION TWO THE PROFESSION OF THE CHRISTIAN FAITH

185 Whoever says "I believe" says "I pledge myself to what we believe." Communion in faith needs a common language of faith, normative for all and uniting all in the same confession of faith.
