PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

"We are the Catholic Community of St. Joseph's Parish, gathered as disciples of Jesus Christ to worship God, to serve others and to grow as loving members of God's family."



One gift, one Spirit: putting our gifts at the service of Jesus` ministry. In today's Gospel, Jesus dramatically declares in the synagogue who he is and what is his work. What he needed to accomplish was clear to him. Paul's letter to the Corinthians tells us that we are all united in this work, no matter who we are or what our particular role might be. Jesus' mission and ministry are achieved by each and every one of us, as members of one body. Do we know and embrace the role that is uniquely ours? Are we able to stand up and identify our own part in Jesus' work? This begins with our roles in everyday life (from last week's Gospel): spouse, parent, child, student, employer /employee, team member, etc. Homework: list up to five roles and what you want to accomplish this week in that role.

Themes: Mercy, Refugee, Religious Life, Unity (Ecumenism), and MUSICAL SELECTIONS: hymns support and strengthen the messages of each Sunday; I encourage you to add your voice and to be aware of what is sung. As we receive either physically or spiritually Holy Communion, we are singing 'One Bread, One Body' and the line 'and we though many throughout the earth, we are one body in this one Lord' - can we allow Holy Communion to break down the barriers of division. Our recessional hymn is the old 'And they know we are Christians by our love' - and this challenges us to 'know and embrace the role that is uniquely ours.'

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity: Jan 18-25. The theme this year is taken from 1 Peter 2:9, 'CALLED TO PROCLAIM THE MIGHTY ACTS OF THE LORD.' All validly baptized people (through water and the Trinitarian formula) are regarded as true Christian brothers and sisters. Our communion with the one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church is perfect or imperfect according to our communion to the teachings of Christ (each various Christian Church believing they are promoting the true teaching). In this week of prayer for unity, we recognize and respect the various beliefs but we commit to the bigger role that baptism imparts to all the baptized, and that is, to proclaim how the Lord is powerfully working in our lives. An example of this working together was the sharing of St.Joseph's Church with Smithers Christian Reformed Church—each respected the other's beliefs and each was able to proclaim the mighty works of the Lord each Sunday.

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) **SECTION TWO** THE PROFESSION OF THE CHRISTIAN FAITH

186 From the beginning, the apostolic Church expressed and handed on her faith in brief formula normative for all. But already very early on, the Church also wanted to gather the essential elements of her faith into organic and articulated summaries, intended especially for candidates for Baptism:

This synthesis of faith was not made to accord with human opinions, but rather what was of the greatest importance was gathered from all the Scriptures, to present the one teaching of the faith in its entirety. And just as the mustard seed contains a great number of branches in a tiny grain, so too this summary of faith encompassed in a few words the whole knowledge of the true religion contained in the Old and the New Testaments.

187 Such syntheses are called "professions of faith" since they summarize the faith that Christians profess. They are called "creeds" on account of what is usually their first word in Latin: credo ("I believe"). They are also called "symbols of faith".
