PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

"We are the Catholic Community of St. Joseph's Parish, gathered as disciples of Jesus Christ to worship God, to serve others and to grow as loving members of God's family."



Lord throughout these 40 days (the readings).

Todays' readings remind us that we live with the "burden" of choice. God is a patient, loving God who hears the cries and suffering of his people. Mercy is unceasingly available to all. And yet, with the freedom to choose, our actions have consequences that sometimes bring pain and suffering to ourselves or others. To these situations let us choose to bring the gifts of repentance and mercy that have first been given to us through Christ. The warning in the parable of the fig tree is that God's patience is never exhausted ('let me fertilize one more time') but that our time to act is limited ('if after a year'). We must act now to bear fruit. Homework: review your Lenten promises to pray, fast, give alms, and re -invigorate your efforts. If no Lenten promises have been made, consider starting now.

JOURNEY THROUGH THE MASS: Intro,

Word, Gifts, Eucharistic Prayer, Communion, Conclusion. Find an insert explaining how the preparation of the altar and gifts, although the beginning of the eucharistic celebration, has a secondary character since it prepares for and leads to the eucharistic prayer. The altar is prepared; the gifts are "set apart" and presented as a sign of the community's desire to incorporate itself in the sacrifice of Christ (the rite gradually expanded with the people themselves bringing the gifts to the altar); the bread and the wine are placed on the altar as the presider praises God for his gifts which will become the body and blood of the Lord; finally in the prayer over the gifts the priest sums up the meaning of all that has taken place. The purpose of the rite is to prepare the altar, the gifts, and the community for the offering to come.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS DURING

LENT: Fridays at 7pm. The Stations of the Cross are a 14-step Catholic devotion commemorating Jesus Christ's last day on Earth. The 14 devotions, or stations, focus on specific events of His last day. The stations are commonly used as a mini pilgrimage as the individual moves from station to station. At each station a specific event from Christ's last day is recalled and meditated on. Specific prayers are recited, then the individual moves to the next station until all 14 are complete. In our Parish, various groups led this service. See the schedule in the bulletin.



From the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) ARTICLE I

"I BELIEVE IN GOD THE FATHER ALMIGHTY, **CREATOR OF HEAVEN AND EARTH"**

Paragraph 1. I Believe in God

199 "I believe in God": this first affirmation of the Apostles' Creed is also the most fundamental. The whole Creed speaks of God, and when it also speaks of man and of the world it does so in relation to God. The other articles of the Creed all depend on the first, just as the remaining Commandments make the first explicit. The other articles help us to know God better as he revealed himself progressively to men. "The faithful first profess their belief in God."

I. "I BELIEVE IN ONE GOD"

200 These are the words with which the Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed begins. The confession of God's oneness, which has its roots in the divine revelation of the Old Covenant, is inseparable from the profession of God's existence and is equally fundamental. God is unique; there is only one God: "The Christian faith confesses that God is one in nature, substance and essence."
