Pastor's Note

Fr. Pier Pandolfo St. Joseph's Parish and St. Anthony's Mission Parish

<u>Discipleship: a spirit of focus on Jerusalem</u> Jesus had a single focus: fulfilling what he was called to be and do. And so he headed for Jerusalem and what he knew was inevitable there. He warned the disciples — and us — not to be distracted in our calling by life's ordinary demands or the possibility of discomfort, pain or death. It's hard to be singleminded with so many competing priorities in life. How do we balance our baptismal calling with the other demands we encounter? Where is our focus? <u>Homework</u>: focus endures difficulties and ignores distractions; examine what is the central focus of your home.

Extra-ordinary Year of Mercy: Corporeal Work: shelter the homeless: Concrete exercise: visit or donate to a homeless shelter. Spiritual exercise: think about how <u>God IS sheltering</u> me; examine the home I live in for what I think is important; and reflecting on Mt 7:24-27, I can ask myself, 'What is the rock that my house is built on?'

Quote from Pope Benedict: "Was the Council a wrong road that we must now retrace if we are to save the Church? The voices of those who say that it was are becoming louder and their followers more numerous. Among the more obvious phenomena of the last years must be counted the increasing number of integralist groups in which the desire for piety, for the sense of mystery, is finding satisfaction. We must be on our guard against minimizing these movements. Without a doubt, they represent a sectarian zealotry that is the antithesis of Catholicity. We cannot too firmly resist them. But we must likewise ask ourselves, in all earnestness, why such contractions and distortions of faith and piety have such an effect and are able to attract those who, by the basic conviction of their faith as well as by personal inclination, are in no way attracted by sectarianism. What drives them into a milieu in which they do not belong? Why have they lost the feeling of being at home in the larger Church? Are all their reproaches unfounded? Is it not, for example, really strange that we have never heard bishops react as strongly against distortions in the heart of the liturgy as they react today against the use of a missal of the Church that, after all, has been in existence since the time of Pius V? Let it be said again: we should not adopt a sectarian attitude, but neither should we omit the examination of conscience to which these facts compel us."

Rose Prince Pilgrimage, July 8-10: happens outside Fraser Lake at the Lejac school site. Rose Prince, a student who later become a care parent at the residential school, died at the age of 34 in 1949. Two years later in 1951 her body was found to be incorrupt. Beginning in 1990, there has been a gathering around her new burial site. The guest speaker this year is Deacon Rennie Nahanee, coordinator for the First Nations Office for the Archdiocese of Vancouver.

A Journey Through the Mass

Liturgy of the Word

As the Eucharist became more separated from the Fellowship meal, and as Christians were expelled from the synagogues, there developed a more formal scripture service whose structure was probably influenced by the synagogue morning prayer service.

Generally by the sixth century the service of the Eucharist was preceded by the service of the Word. Different numbers of readings, ranging from 3 to 6 were chosen, with the belief that Rome's practice was 3 readings. Further what started as continuous readings of scripture developed into thematic readings when the liturgical year developed (i.e. readings appropriate for Easter and Christmas).

Currently, the lectionary arranges the Sunday readings in a three-year cycle, the characteristic feature of each year being the gospel: year A is based on Matthew, year B on Mark and year C on Luke. St. John's Gospel occurs on the first Sundays of Lent, during the Easter Season, and on certain Sunday's during year B.

"Readings from Scripture and the chants between the readings form the main part of the liturgy of the word. The homily, profession of faith, and general intercessions or prayer of the faithful expand and complete this part of the mass." (GIRM #33)

I. "IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER AND OF THE SON AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT"
