Pastor's Note

Fr. Pier Pandolfo St. Joseph's Parish and St. Anthony's Mission Parish

<u>Discipleship: a spirit of hospitality.</u> What should we do when the divine comes into our lives? God may come unexpectedly, in the guise of a stranger, or through a familiar face. Above all else, we are called to be welcoming people. Hospitality is expressed in many ways, and each of us is different. Hospitality creates the atmosphere where people can encounter God, creates the attitude where we can encounter God. Todays' readings reflect ways of welcoming others. **Homework**: count how many religious symbols are in your home, in your room.

Extra-ordinary Year of Mercy: Spiritual Work: admonish the sinner: Concrete exercise: celebrate sacrament of reconciliation. Spiritual exercise: think about how God admonishes me in my sin; meditate on John8:1-11 (Neither do I condemn; go and sin no more) or on Luke 7:36-50 (a creditor had two debtors, one owed 10 and one owed 500)

Quote from Pope Benedict: we are reminded of our mortality.

"Pain and sickness can paralyze us as human beings; they can demoralize us not only physically, but also psychologically and spiritually. On the other hand, they can also rupture our complacency, our spiritual sluggishness, and enable us to find our true selves. The struggle with suffering is the occasion of crucial decisions, for it is here that we are confronted concretely and inescapably with the fact that our life is not at our own disposal, is not really our own. We can, if we choose, answer defiantly that we will try to acquire the power to make it so, and thus deliver ourselves up to a basic attitude of hopeless anger. But we can also answer by trying to trust this power and to let ourselves be led by it unafraid and without worrying anxiously about our own situation. In that way, our attitude to pain, to the presence of death in life, merges with the basic attitude that we call love. For, at this point, we come to realize that we encounter this impossibility of disposing as we will of our own life not only in the physical limitations of life, such as sickness, but also in the central region of our humanness insofar as our innate desire is to be loved. Love is the true nourishment of the soul. But love—that is, that of which we are most in need—is not something we can provide for ourselves; we must await its coming and will most assuredly not acquire it so long as we try to procure it for ourselves. In this case, too, our dependence may generate anger. We can try to shake it off, reduce it to a satisfaction of such needs as can be fulfilled without any great adventure of spirit or heart. Or we can accept it and remain confidently open to it in the certainty that the Power that has our life always at his disposal will not deceive us."

A Journey Through the Mass

Liturgy of the Eucharist Reflection

"At the Last Supper, on the night when He was betrayed, our Savior instituted the Eucharistic Sacrifice of His Body and Blood. He did this in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the Cross throughout the centuries until He should come again, and so to entrust to His beloved spouse, the Church, a memorial of His death and resurrection: a sacrament of love, a sign of unity, a bond of charity, a paschal banquet in which Christ is consumed, the mind is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us" (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, art. 47)

A: Preparation of the Gifts

The preparation of the altar and gifts, although the beginning of the eucharistic celebration, has a secondary character since it prepares for and leads to the eucharistic prayer. The altar is prepared; the gifts are "set apart" and presented as a sign of the community's desire to incorporate itself in the sacrifice of Christ (the rite gradually expanded with the people themselves bringing the gifts to the altar); the bread and the wine are placed on the altar as the presider praises God for his gifts which will become the body and blood of the Lord; finally in the prayer over the gifts the priest sums up the meaning of all that has taken place. The purpose of the rite is to prepare the altar, the gifts, and the community for the offering to come.

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

"I BELIEVE IN GOD THE FATHER ALMIGHTY, CREATOR OF HEAVEN AND EARTH" Paragraph 2. The Father

II. THE REVELATION OF GOD AS TRINITY The Father revealed by the Son

240 Jesus revealed that God is Father in an unheard-of sense: he is Father not only in being Creator; he is eternally Father by his relationship to his only Son who, reciprocally, is Son only in relation to his Father: "No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and any one to whom the Son chooses to reveal him." 64

241 For this reason the apostles confess Jesus to be the Word: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God"; as "the image of the invisible God"; as the "radiance of the glory of God and the very stamp of his
