### Pastor's Note

Fr. Pier Pandolfo St. Joseph's Parish and St. Anthony's Mission Parish

**Discipleship: a spirit linking persistence in a healthy way to abundance.** Is there a limit to mercy, forgiveness, hope, intercession? We sometimes run out of steam or reach impenetrable walls. But today's readings are about abundance and persistence, grounded in love. With God, there are no limits to mercy or promise. We don't fully understand God's mercy or the meaning or efficacy of prayer, but we are urged to continue head-on. We are invited into loving relationship with God and one another, where there are no bounds or limits. **Homework:** With Abraham, let us pick someone(X) to pray for and intercede for them in a dialogue following Abraham's pattern: God, if X does 100 good things will you bless them?; God if X does 50 good things, will you bless them?, etc

Extra-ordinary Year of Mercy: Spiritual Work: instruct the ignorant: Concrete exercise: take time to tutor a student, a child, or a parent. Spiritual exercise: think about how **God** instructs me on virtue and a virtuous life; meditate on the numerous teachings in Mathew chapters 5, 6, 7 – the sermon on the mount.

**<u>Quote from Pope Benedict:</u>** living catechesis is dissolved by **lifeless technology**. "That catechesis is in trouble these days is a commonplace that requires no lengthy proof. The reasons for the crisis and its results have been frequently and exhaustively treated. In the technical world of man's making, there is no immediate encounter with the Creator; it is always himself that man encounters first. Its basic structure is its ability to be fashioned, and the manner of its certainty is the certainty of the calculable. For that reason, the question of salvation is not dependent on a God who never appears, but, here too, on the ability of the individual who wants to be the engineer of himself and of history. In like manner, he no longer derives even his moral standards from a language that has become alien to him—a language of creation and Creator. Creation is silent for him as regards morals; it speaks only the language of mathematics, of what is technically useful to men. But even then its moral exhortation remains indeterminate.... On the one hand, this whole view of life is reflected in the new media, and on the other hand, it is nourished by them. Today, the depiction of the world and its events has a stronger impact on consciousness than does one's own experience of reality. All this has its effect also on catechesis, which finds its classic social supporters—family and parish—still ruptured, which can no longer rely on the experience of a lived faith in the living Church and seems doomed, in consequence, to speechlessness in an age when language and thought are derived largely from the experiences of man's self-made world."

#### A Journey Through the Mass

#### Liturgy of the Eucharist

The accounts of the Last Supper highlight certain basic actions of Jesus that the Church as made into the 4 actions of: bread and wine taken and blessed, broken and shared. This takes place today as we (a) prepare the gifts of bread and wine (b) pray the Eucharistic Prayer and (c) share in Communion.

#### Eucharistic Prayer

There are many close connections between the Eucharistic Prayer and the table prayers required at every Jewish meal. Toward the beginning of the meal a Jewish prayer of blessing and praise to God known as the BEREKAH was offered over bread—the bread was shared. Toward the end of the meal, a more solemn triple Berekah was offered over a cup of wine—a Berekah praising God firstly, for all of creation; secondly, thanking God for the whole **history of salvation; and thirdly, supplicating God's continued offering of** salvation in the future, especially by sending a Messiah. At special meals, there was the recitation of the HAGGADAH—making present the liberating deeds of God in the past and thereby applying their saving power in the present to those participating in the meal.

Jesus took the basic form of a Jewish meal and transformed it when he added the words "This is my body", "This is my blood". The apostles who gathered after the death and resurrection of Jesus celebrated these same Jewish –rooted meals of praise, thanksgiving and supplication but there was new meaning.

The early Church did not have liturgical books for the Eucharist, instead the presider would improvise based on the Jewish model of praise, thanksgiving and supplication. We now have 4 Eucharistic Prayers approved for general use and others for specific uses (reconciliation, children, holidays, etc)

#### From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

#### "I BELIEVE IN GOD THE FATHER ALMIGHTY, CREATOR OF HEAVEN AND EARTH" Paragraph 2. The Father

II. THE REVELATION OF GOD AS TRINITY 242 Following this apostolic tradition, the Church confessed at the first ecumenical council at Nicaea (325) that the Son is "consubstantial" with the Father, that is, one only God with him.<sup>66</sup> The second ecumenical council, held at Constantinople in 381, kept this expression in its formulation of the Nicene Creed and confessed "the only-begotten Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, light from light, true God from true God, begotten not made, consubstantial with the Father".<sup>67</sup>
