Pastor's Note

Fr. Pier Pandolfo St. Joseph's Parish and St. Anthony's Mission Parish

Discipleship: a spirit of enduring conflict. Many of us have experienced conflict around our faith or religious beliefs. We haven't paid the price of discipleship in blood, as many have done and still do today. But how do our conflicts reflect what Jesus told us to expect? Are our experiences merely **uncomfortable or inconvenient?** Do they reflect the seriousness of our commitment to the Gospel? It's jarring to remember that discipleship can disturb our peace and divide us from one another. **Homework:** pray the Lamb of God .. Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us... grant us peace'

Extra-ordinary Year of Mercy: Spiritual Work: bear

wrongs patiently: Concrete exercise: bear a wrong. Spiritual exercise: think about how <u>God bears my wrongs</u> patiently; examine my actions hurting others; reflect on the crucifixion (Mark 14 and 15), on bringing gifts to the altar (Math5:20-24).

Quote from Pope Benedict: not conflict but respect at all

stages of life: "Should we not once again realize and admit to one another that no age should be a cause of shame for us if we accept it interiorly and live it as it should be lived? Should we not, at this juncture of time past and time renewed, learn once again that to be what we should be we need the fullness of the time allotted to us from childhood to old age? Should we not—each of us—try to accept with better grace the entire span of our own human life and to find tolerance—no, recognition—for the time of life other people are experiencing because we know that all of us have something to give one another? To state the matter more concretely, let us ask ourselves what a world and a Church would be like without the cheerful, guileless, and unfeigned faith of children, whose childhood should not be terminated by a premature puberty as is so often the case today. What would a world and a Church be like without the urgent restlessness and questioning of young people as they strive toward their future? What would they be like without the strength and determination of those who are at the height of their powers? What would they be like without the mature experience, the quiet patience, and the resigned serenity of the elderly? And what would all of us be like without trust in one another, without the readiness to see and accept one another as we are? At this time, when the future is our dominant concern and when, for that very reason, we would like to stop the clocks at a definite time, perhaps the most important thing we can do is, by far, to learn to say Yes to older people and to our own growing old and, in doing so, to accept time and the future."

A Journey Through the Mass

Starting with the seventh century various forms of purifying the **priest's mouth, fingers, and the chalice arose at Rome and elsewhere.** The functional task of cleansing is now simplified and may even take place after the celebration to allow both ministers and people an opportunity for prayerful silence or common song before the prayer after communion which serves to conclude the rite.

Even the restoration of the communion procession and communion song is to emphasize the communal dimension. The offering the **community has brought to the altar (God's fruit and our work) has** been accepted, and we receive as a response of communion.

Reflection

The rites of preparation for communion are a structural link between the eucharistic prayers and the reception of the eucharist. They are to "lead directly to the communion of the people" (GI no. 56). Their purpose is to prepare the whole assembly for its participation in the Lord's body and blood. Mutual love and reconciliation are the seeds and fruits of the sacrament shared in communal fashion by ministers and people. Just as the elements of bread and wine have been changed, so we commit to being part of a change that brings peace and unity to all of life.

What is the purpose of the rites preparing for communion? To what extend do these rites actually "lead directly to the communion of the people" (GI no. 56)?

The Father revealed by the Son

II. THE REVELATION OF GOD AS TRINITY The Father and the son revealed by the spirit 246 The Latin tradition of the <u>Creed confesses</u> that the <u>Spirit</u> "proceeds from the <u>Father</u> and the <u>Son</u> (filioque)". the <u>Council</u> of <u>Florence</u> in 1438 explains: "The <u>Holy Spirit</u> is <u>eternally</u> from <u>Father</u> and <u>Son</u>; He has his <u>nature</u> and <u>subsistence</u> at once (<u>simul</u>) from the <u>Father</u> and the <u>Son</u>. He <u>proceeds eternally</u> from both as from one <u>principle</u> and through one <u>spiration</u>... And, since the <u>Father</u> has through generation given to the <u>only-begotten Son</u> everything that <u>belongs</u> to the <u>Father</u>, except being <u>Father</u>, the <u>Son</u> has also <u>eternally</u> from the <u>Father</u>, from whom he is <u>eternally born</u>, that the <u>Holy Spirit proceeds</u> from the <u>Son</u>."

247 The affirmation of the filioque does not appear in the Creed confessed in 381 at Constantinople. But Pope St. Leo I, following an ancient Latin and Alexandrian tradition, had already confessed it dogmatically in 447, even before Rome, in 451 at the Council of Chalcedon, came to recognize and receive the Symbol of 381. the use of this formula in the Creed was gradually admitted into the Latin liturgy (between the eighth and eleventh centuries). the introduction of the filioque into the Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed by the Latin liturgy constitutes moreover, even today, a point of disagreement with the Orthodox Churches.
