PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

Pastor's Note Fr. Pier Pandolfo St. Joseph's Parish and St. Anthony's Mission Parish

Rejoice when the lost are found. Today's readings share three images of God in which there is rejoicing on the part of God and on our part. Isaiah uses the loving father image, and the Gospel uses the images of good shepherd and committed mother. In all cases, God rejoices when what was lost is found; but for us to rejoice, we need to recognize that we are lost. This is a challenge as in today's culture sensitive to promoting the good rather than correcting the wrong, we might find it hard to acknowledge that I am lost in sin and need to be found. But if the Gospel truly is GOOD NEWS, then is there a healthy way for us to look at our weaknesses. This is a personal process, unique to the individual. The Church's answer is a universal one: a nightly examination of conscience and the sacrament of reconciliation. **Homework:** pray the Confiteor, I confess to Almighty God.....

Countdown to Nov 20, end of Extra-ordinary Year of Mercy: Corporeal Work: Feed the Hungry: Concrete exercise: I could feed the hungry, work in Soup Kitchens, make donations towards works that alleviate world hunger. Spiritual exercise: think about how <u>God IS feeding me</u>, I am hungry; engage in a regular practice of fasting to help me experience my hunger; and reflecting on John6, I can ask myself, 'Do I believe that Jesus is the BREAD OF LIFE?'

Diocesan Appeal Spirituality: The Diocesan Appeal is to be seen within the context of STEWARDSHIP. In Genesis 1:28 we read that God blessed humans and gave them stewardship over all the created earth. But if God gives us the gift of all the earth, God also gives us the responsibility to take care of it. We exercise this responsibility with our TIME, our TALENTS, and our TREASURE (money). The spirituality that helps us make decisions about how to spend our time, talent and treasure is rooted in GRATITUDE, TRUST, GENEROSITY. We have gratitude for all we have; we trust that God will continue to provide for all our needs; and we then can be generous to respond to the needs of others.

LayFormation Program: HEARTS TRANSFORMED: One way of looking at the Lay Formation program is to recognize our poverty with regards to our Catholic Faith, and in the words of the Gospel, to see our Catholic Faith as something that is partially lost and we need to find it, or that our we have logs in eyes that are preventing us from seeing our Catholic Faith for the GOOD NEWS that it is meant to be. I encourage everyone to make some sort of commitment to deepening their faith through this lay formation opportunity: for some, this means a complete commitment to the program, and for others only a partial commitment at this time. NOTE WELL, I encourage those who are able to make a complete commitment and to sign up for the DIOCESAN HEARTS TRANSFORMED program.

A Journey Through the Mass

Introductory Rites

As early as the mid-second century the celebration of the Eucharist, already separated from its setting with a regular meal, was usually preceded by a scripture service. The people gathered in silence and, when all had arrived, a reader began to proclaim the word. This ancient practice of beginning immediately with the readings was preserved in the Roman liturgy of Good Friday till 1956.

But the psychological desire to give a definitive starting point to the celebration and to provide an initial experience of prayer resulted in the gradual development of various introductory rites and formulas. In fifth-century Africa St. Augustine greeted the people before the Scriptures were proclaimed. In late seventh-century Rome the pope with his ministers passed through the assembly in procession and then began with an initial prayer. From the Catechism of the Catholic Church "I BELIEVE IN GOD THE FATHER ALMIGHTY, CREATOR OF HEAVEN AND EARTH" The Father revealed by the Son

III. THE HOLY TRINITY IN THE TEACHING OF THE FAITH The dogma of the Holy Trinity is One. We do not confess three Gods, but one God in three persons, the "consubstantial Trinity". The divine persons do not share the one divinity among themselves but each of them is God whole and entire: "The Father is that which the Son is, the Son that which the Father is, the Father and the Son that which the Holy Spirit is, i.e. by nature one God." In the words of the Fourth Lateran Council (1215), "Each of the persons is that supreme reality, viz., the divine substance, essence or nature."254 The divine persons are really distinct from one another. "God is one but not solitary." "Father", "Son", "Holy Spirit" are not simply names designating modalities of the divine being, for they are really distinct from one another: "He is not the Father who is the Son, nor is the Son he who is the Father, nor is the Holy Spirit he who is the Father or the Son." They are distinct from one another in their relations of origin: "It is the Father who generates, the Son who is begotten, and the Holy Spirit who proceeds." The divine Unity is Triune..
