Pastor's Note

Attitude of Gratitude. Two stories of healing in today's readings have common threads. Both Naaman and the Samaritan are outsiders, judged by some as unworthy of healing. But the faith of each is related to God's healing, and that healing leads to expressions of gratitude. God's gifts are freely given to surprising people in surprising ways. Faith is an essential component. But equally important is gratitude. Homework: Enjoy the Thanksgiving long weekend.

Countdown to Nov 20, end of Extra-ordinary Year of Mercy: **Corporeal Work: shelter the homeless:** Concrete exercise: visit or donate to a homeless shelter. Spiritual exercise: think about how **God IS sheltering me**; examine the home I live in for what I think is important; and reflecting on Mt 7:24-27, I can ask myself, 'What is the rock that my house is built on?'

A Journey Through the Mass

Liturgy of the Word

As the Eucharist became more separated from the Fellowship meal, and as Christians were expelled from the synagogues, there developed a more formal scripture service whose structure was probably influenced by the synagogue morning prayer service.

Generally by the sixth century the service of the Eucharist was preceded by the service of the Word. Different numbers of readings, ranging from 3 to 6 were chosen, with the belief that Rome's practice was 3 readings. Further what started as continuous readings of scripture developed into thematic readings when the liturgical year developed (i.e. readings appropriate for Easter and Christmas).

Currently, the lectionary arranges the Sunday readings in a three-year cycle, the characteristic feature of each year being the gospel: year A is based on Matthew, year B on Mark and year C on Luke. St. John's Gospel occurs on the first Sundays of Lent, during the Easter Season, and on certain Sunday's during year B.

"Readings from Scripture and the chants between the readings form the main part of the liturgy of the word. The homily, profession of faith, and general intercessions or prayer of the faithful expand and complete this part of the mass." (GIRM #33)

"I BELIEVE IN GOD THE FATHER ALMIGHTY, CREATOR OF HEAVEN AND EARTH"

IV. THE DIVINE WORKS AND THE TRINITARIAN MISSIONS

258 The whole divine economy is the common work of the three divine persons. For as the Trinity has only one and the same natures so too does it have only one and the same operation: "The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are not three principles of creation but one principle." However, each divine person performs the common work according to his unique personal property. Thus the Church confesses, following the New Testament, "one God and Father from whom all things are, and one Lord Jesus Christ, through whom all things are, and one Holy Spirit in whom all things are". It is above all the divine missions of the Son's Incarnation and the gift of the Holy Spirit that show forth the properties of the divine persons.
