Pastor's Note

Be Persistent in Prayer. Hang in there," we say. Today's readings remind us that the call to be persistent in prayer isn't new. Israel needed to hear it, and the disciples were told by Jesus to "pray always." It helps to know that we don't need endless harangues, sophisticated words or lofty arguments. The God of mercy does hear us. The challenge is to be open to God's answer. Homework: For this week, be persistent at 3pm every day to pray "Lord have mercy".

Countdown to Nov 20, end of Extra-ordinary Year of Mercy: Corporeal Work: visit the sick: Concrete exercise: visit someone sick or bring them holy communion. Spiritual exercise: think about how God does not abandon me when I am sick; examine the significant times that I have been ill; reflect on John 11, the raising of Lazarus (v26 whoever believes in me will never die).

DAA Spirituality-Gratitude: Trust: Generosity Today is COMMITMENT SUNDAY for the Diocesan Appeal. Thank you for your participation and your generosity of TIME, TALENT, and TREASURE.

Youth group starting: This Monday, October 17th, 7-8:30pm in the school GYM.

Pope Francis on the ROSARY: Pope Francis says the rosary, in many ways, is the "synthesis of the history of God's mercy," but that far from removing us from life's problems it "demands that we immerse ourselves in the history of each day, so as to grasp the signs of Christ's presence in our midst." The Pope said this as he celebrated a Vigil for the Marian Jubilee in the context of the Year of Mercy. The Pope further said that the rosary asks us to "reflect on how God comes into our own lives, so as to be able to welcome him and follow him." "We are disciples, but also missionaries," he reflected, "bringing Christ wherever he asks us to be present." The gift of his presence shouldn't be kept to ourselves: "On the contrary, we are called to share with everyone his love, his tenderness, his goodness and his mercy.

A Journey Through the Mass

Liturgy of the Word Reflection

The purpose of the liturgy of the word is to make Christ present, Himself speaking. "In the readings (explained by the homily), God is speaking to his people, opening up to them the mystery of salvation... Through the chants the people make God's word their own and through the profession of faith they affirm their adherence to it. Finally, having been fed by his word, they make their petitions in the general intercessions for the needs of the Church and for the salvation of the whole world." (GIRM #33 continued).

Just as Christ is present in the eucharist to give himself as food, so he is present when the Scriptures are proclaimed to offer his message of salvation and to arouse faith in those who hear his message. "Faith, then comes through hearing, and what is heard is the word of Christ." (Romans 10:17)

The liturgy of the word, is not just a preparation for the celebration of the eucharist. A profound relationship exists between the two: Jesus is the living word <u>and</u> Jesus is the bread of life are two aspects of the same mystery—salvation.

Questions for Reflection

- 1. What is the purpose of the liturgy of the word?
- 2. How can the word be better proclaimed?
- 3. How can I prepare myself to listen?
