### Pastor's Note

Fr. Pier Pandolfo St. Joseph's Parish and St. Anthony's Mission Parish

To be encouraged in the face of the unknown. "What comes next?" is an old question about life after death. Today's readings encourage persistence in the face of the unknown. We Christians are heirs of faith in the resurrection, but that does not guarantee courage in living our faith in the here and now. Keeping our eye on life beyond death is critical, but how we live our faith each day is equally important. With our eyes fixed on the justice of heaven, we encourage one another to live peacefully in a world torn apart by war and injustice; with our eyes fixed on the joy of heaven, we encourage the downtrodden who are trying to make ends meet; with our eyes fixed on the unboundedness of heaven, we can live with unanswered questions and find meaning to life. Homework: Pray the prayer for the dead: Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord. And let the perpetual light shine upon them. And may the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

Countdown to Nov 20, end of Extra-ordinary Year of Mercy: Spiritual Work: admonish the sinner: Concrete exercise: celebrate sacrament of reconciliation. Spiritual exercise: think about how God admonishes me in my sin; meditate on John8:1-11 (Neither do I condemn; go and sin no more) or on Luke 7:36-50 (a creditor had two debtors, one owed 10 & one owed 500)

Pope Francis shares a story in this Year of Mercy: The Pope shared the following story of an elderly woman who helped an immigrant. As the lady came across this young man, who was without shoes, they began to speak and she asked him, "What are you searching for?" "Saint Peter's to go through the Holy Door," he responded to her question. Moved with sympathy, she thought to herself: "But how can he walk? .. He doesn't even have shoes. She insisted on offering a taxi to bring him. When the taxi driver stopped however, he was hesitant to accept the passenger, as he smelled very badly. However, the driver agreed, as the immigrant and the lady got in and chatted on the way to the Vatican. They spoke about his history, what he has lived through, the trials, the war, etc. By the end of the ride, the lady went to pay, and the driver, who hesitated to accept them, said: "No, Signora. It is I who must pay for you, because you made me listen to a story that changed my heart."

November, month of saints and souls and end times.

During the month of November, we will be bringing up to the altar the Book of the Dead, a book where everyone can enter the names of their deceased. It will be a reminder of the infinite graces of the mass poured out for our loved ones, and a witness to the catholic practice of praying for the dead. Further to this belief is the celebration of ALL SAINTS (Nov 01) where we reflect and remember all those who already enjoy eternal life with God, and the celebration of ALL SOULS (Nov 02) where we remember and pray for all those who have died that God be merciful to them and grant them eternal life. Please note on Nov 02 that there will be three masses: 9am, 12:15pm, and 6:15pm.

## A Journey Through the Mass

Liturgy of the Eucharist Reflection

"At the Last Supper, on the night when He was betrayed, our Savior instituted the Eucharistic Sacrifice of His Body and Blood. He did this in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the Cross throughout the centuries until He should come again, and so to entrust to His beloved spouse, the Church, a memorial of His death and resurrection: a sacrament of love, a sign of unity, a bond of charity, a paschal banquet in which Christ is consumed, the mind is filled with


## grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us" Preparation of the Gifts

The preparation of the altar and gifts, although the beginning of the eucharistic celebration, has a secondary character since it prepares for and leads to the eucharistic prayer. The altar is prepared; the gifts are "set apart" and presented as a sign of the community's desire to incorporate itself in the sacrifice of Christ ( the rite gradually expanded with the people themselves bringing the gifts to the altar); the bread and the wine are placed on the altar as the presider praises God for his gifts which will become the body and blood of the Lord; finally in the prayer over the gifts the priest sums up the meaning of all that has taken place. The purpose of the rite is to prepare the altar, the gifts, and the community for the offering to come.

#### **Questions for Reflection**

- 1. What is the purpose of this rite?
- 2. How do the bread and wine represent our lives?

3.Just as bread and wine are "made by human hands", does the rite to participate in God's continued work of saving people?

# From the Catechism of the Catholic Church "I BELIEVE IN GOD THE FATHER ALMIGHTY, CREATOR OF HEAVEN AND EARTH"

IV. THE DIVINE WORKS AND THE TRINITARIAN MISSIONS

261 The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and of Christian life. God alone can make it known to us by revealing himself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. 262 The Incarnation of God's Son reveals that God is the eternal Father and that the Son is consubstantial with the Father, which means that, in the Father and with the Father the Son is one and the same God.

263 The mission of the Holy Spirit, sent by the Father in the name of the Son and by the Son "from the Father" reveals that, with them, the Spirit is one and the same God. "With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified" (Nicene Creed). 264 "The Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father as the first principle and, by the eternal gift of this to the Son, from the communion of both the Father and the Son"
