Pastor's Note

Fr. Pier Pandolfo St. Joseph's Parish and St. Anthony's Mission Parish

To be encouraged in the face of the unknown. "What comes next?" is an old question about life after death. Today's readings encourage persistence in the face of the unknown. We Christians are heirs of faith in the resurrection, but that does not guarantee courage in living our faith in the here and now. Keeping our eye on life beyond death is critical, but how we live our faith each day is equally important. With our eyes fixed on the justice of heaven, we encourage one another to live peacefully in a world torn apart by war and injustice; with our eyes fixed on the joy of heaven, we encourage the downtrodden who are trying to make ends meet; with our eyes fixed on the unboundedness of heaven, we can live with unanswered questions and find meaning to life. Homework: Pray the prayer for the dead: Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord. And let the perpetual light shine upon them. And may the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

St.Joseph Holy Door: we marked one of our doors into the Church as our Holy Door by affixing an image of the three official Holy Doors in our Diocese (the Cathedral in Prince George, Resurrection Church in Ft.St.John, and Annunciation Church in Prince Rupert). There was a bus pilgrimage in June to Annunciation Church and we satisfied the requirements for the indulgence: attended mass, celebrated confession, prayed for the intentions of the Holy Father. As the special year of mercy comes to an end on November 20 in Rome, we will be closing our door(s) on November 13. I will be available for the sacrament of reconciliation on November 12 from 4 to 4:45pm and after 5pm mass, and on November 13, I will be available from 8 to 8:45am before mass.

Countdown to Nov 20, end of Extra-ordinary Year of Mercy: Spiritual Work: instruct the ignorant: Concrete exercise: take time to tutor a student, a child, or a parent. Spiritual exercise: think about how God instructs me on virtue and a virtuous life; meditate on the numerous teachings in Mathew chapters 5, 6, 7 – the sermon on the mount.

Entering my 25th year of priesthood: I was ordained on November 06, 1992 and next November I will be celebrating my 25th anniversary with you. It is the responsibility of the priest to organize his 25th, and so throughout this year I will have gatherings to express my thanks to you (and the Diocese) for all the prayers and support I have received. Since my arrival in Smithers, it has been a pleasure to get to know you and your life of faith. Thank you and God bless us.

A Journey Through the Mass

Liturgy of the Eucharist

Preparation of the Altar: The altar is the focus for the liturgy. It is the table of the sacrifice and the table of the heavenly banquet uniting the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross with the eternal banquet at the end of time. The altar is prepared with the corporal, purificator, chalice and missal.

Presentation of the Gifts: As early as the 3rd century the people first brought bread and wine and later (7th century) they would bring other precious gifts of oil, wheat, grapes, candles. This procession was mirrored at the communion procession when the transformed bread and wine were received back by the people.

Preparation Song: To fill in the time for the procession of the gifts; varied as the time of the procession varied in length depending on what gifts were brought to the altar.

Prayers at the Preparation of the Gifts: FOCUS IS PRAISING GOD and not on making an offering Priest: Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the bread (wine) we offer you: fruit of the earth (vine) and work of human hands, it will become for us the bread of life (our spiritual drink). ALL: Blessed be God for ever.

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church "I BELIEVE IN GOD THE FATHER ALMIGHTY, CREATOR OF HEAVEN AND EARTH"

IV. THE DIVINE WORKS AND THE TRINITARIAN MISSIONS

264 "The Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father as the first principle and, by the eternal gift of this to the Son, from the communion of both the Father and the Son"

265 By the grace of Baptism "in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit", we are called to share in the life of the Blessed Trinity, here on earth in the obscurity of faith, and after death in eternal light.

266 "Now this is the Catholic faith: We worship one God in the Trinity and the Trinity in unity, without either confusing the persons or dividing the substance; for the person of the Father is one, the Son's is another, the Holy Spirit's another; but the Godhead of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit is one, their glory equal, their majesty coeternal"

267 Inseparable in what they are, the divine persons are also inseparable in what they do. But within the single divine operation each shows forth what is proper to him in the Trinity, especially in the divine missions of the Son's Incarnation and the gift of the Holy Spirit.
