Pastor's Note

Fr. Pier Pandolfo St. Joseph's Parish and St. Anthony's Mission Parish

Our King embraced suffering and death. In today's gospel, the Kingdom and Kingship of Jesus are set in the countercultural context of the cross. As startling as this is, it may be a good shot of realism for those of us who struggle through life. The King we celebrate today bears little semblance to our royal stereotypes. He knew almost no glory in his life, and his Kingdom was hard earned through suffering and death. This is the kind of king we can approach with confidence, for he knows our pain and our need for forgiveness. Purgatory, the required purification (painful) of any remaining stain of sin, is our final participation in the saving action of suffering. Homework: no homework, celebrate the kind of KING we follow.

Countdown to Nov 20, end of Extra-ordinary Year of Mercy: Spiritual Work: comfort the sorrowful:

Concrete exercise: give some time to visiting a person grieving. Spiritual exercise: think about how <u>God is</u> <u>comforting me</u>; review the moments in life when I was grieving; reflect on John11:21-35 Jesus comforts Mary and Martha.

Pope Francis brings to a close the Extraordinary Year of Mercy: Why did Pope Francis call this event? "Jesus Christ is the face of the Father's mercy," Pope Francis said. In this light, "Merciful like the Father" is the motto he chose for the Jubilee Year. It comes from Luke 6:36, "Be merciful just as your Father is merciful." Mercy is the Holy Father's answer to evil. Pope Francis explained, "Here, then, is the reason for the Jubilee: because this is the time for mercy. It is the favorable time to heal wounds, a time not to be weary of meeting all those who are waiting to see and to touch with their hands the signs of the closeness of God, a time to offer everyone the way of forgiveness and reconciliation."

CHANGES TO THE REPORT CARDS

The BC Ministry of Education has been working for several years on the new curriculum. Teachers have been learning about and implementing the new curriculum these past two years. Now, the Ministry of Education has just released a new document of guidelines for communicating student learning to parents. For the 2016-2017 school year, based on Ministry guidelines, Catholic Independent Schools of Prince George (CISPG) has issued a revised Student Reporting Policy. The recommendations which

St. Joseph's School will incorporate this term in our report cards

- 1) no letter grades for grade 4
- 2) for grades K and 1, the performance scale will change from NYM (not yet meeting), APP (approaching), M (meeting) and E (exceeding) to B (beginning - student needs direct support), D (developing – student needs minimal support), A (applying – student works independently)
- 3) for grades 2 to 4, the performance scale will be the new one (above) as well, with the addition of E
- (extending extends ideas and draws connections to new situations).
- 4) for grades 5 to 7, letter grades are described and not assigned to percentages.

A Journey Through the Mass

Liturgy of the Eucharist

The accounts of the Last Supper highlight certain basic actions of Jesus that the Church as made into the 4 actions of: bread and wine taken and blessed, broken and shared. This takes place today as we (a) prepare the gifts of bread and wine (b) pray the Eucharistic Prayer and (c) share in Communion.

Eucharistic Prayer

There are many close connections between the Eucharistic Prayer and the table prayers required at every Jewish meal. Toward the beginning of the meal a Jewish prayer of blessing and praise to God known as the BEREKAH was offered over bread—the bread was shared. Toward the end of the meal, a more solemn triple Berekah was offered over a cup of wine—a Berekah praising God firstly, for all of creation; secondly, thanking God for the whole history of salvation; and thirdly,

supplicating God's continued offering of salvation in the future, especially by sending a Messiah. At special meals, there was the recitation of the HAGGADAH—making present the liberating deeds of God in the past and thereby applying their saving power in the present to those participating in the meal.

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church "I BELIEVE IN GOD THE FATHER ALMIGHTY, CREATOR OF HEAVEN AND EARTH"

Paragraph 3. THE ALMIGHTY

270 God is the Father Almighty, whose fatherhood and power shed light on one another: God reveals his fatherly omnipotence by the way he takes care of our needs; by the filial adoption that he gives us ("I will be a father to you, and you shall be my sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty"): finally by his infinite mercy, for he displays his power at its height by freely forgiving sins.

271 God's almighty power is in no way arbitrary: "In God, power, essence, will, intellect, wisdom, and justice are all identical. Nothing therefore can be in God's power which could not be in his just will or his wise intellect."
