## Pastor's Note

Fr. Pier Pandolfo St. Joseph's Parish and St. Anthony's Mission Parish

Advent: listen attentively, speak encouragingly

When we point a finger at someone else, three fingers are pointing back at us. In a chaotic world filled with personal, political and often environmental turmoil, it is easy to long for someone coming from the outside to help us, to "fix" things. But today we are reminded that something is also required of us. Preparing for Christ was and is a serious task, involving our own need for hope and repentance. We can look to Jesus for solace and assistance, but we are called to "make straight his paths" and to "produce good fruit as evidence of (our) repentance." His coming makes great demands on us. Homework: Read Genesis 3 where Adam blames Eve and Eve blames the snake; ask for the grace to see your part in the problems and solutions that exist.

D&P - The 80s {see full excerpt from the D&P publication 50 Years of Solidarity' on bulletin board.} The world sees great socioeconomic change due to advances in technology and the start of globalization. As economic liberalization increases in industrialized worlds, many corporations relocate their manufacturing to Asia and Mexico. Developing countries face economic and social difficulties as they endure multiple debt crises, leading them to apply for financial assistance from the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank. Military and dictatorial governments oppress populations in Latin America. Some Church leaders publicly oppose these regimes; the murder of Archbishop Oscar Romero in El Salvador shocks the world and causes an outcry against the brutality of these military dictatorships. A widespread famine forces Ethiopia and other African countries to rely on outside aid to feed their people. At the end of the decade, the global movement against apartheid culminates in actions that target the racist policies of the South African government. D&P starts its first program of education and action, the two pillars of its foundation.

<u>D&P Fall ACTION:</u> to encourage Ottawa to send money to global south for CLIMATE CONTROL issues.

Advent changes to local mass celebrations: we are highlighting that God is speaking to us in Scripture by using the Book of the Gospels and by singing the Alleluia both at the beginning and at the end of the Gospel reading; we are highlighting the need to listen by praying the Eucharistic Prayer more slowly and with musical accompaniment.

## A Journey Through the Mass

### **Liturgy of the Eucharist**

The accounts of the Last Supper highlight certain basic actions of Jesus that the Church as made into the 4 actions of: bread and wine taken and blessed, broken and shared. This takes place today as we (a) prepare the gifts of bread and wine (b) pray the Eucharistic Prayer and (c) share in Communion.

## Share Communion

In the earliest celebrations of the eucharist the bishop had no fixed formula to say after the people's Amen which concluded the eucharistic prayer. Once the bread was broken, ministers and faithful received the body and blood of the Lord.

The growing desire to express such dispositions as mutual love, unity, and forgiveness resulted in an initial expansion before the reception of the eucharist. By the 5th centuries, the Our Father and the sharing of peace were established rites. By the 3rd century, the people prepared themselves with a short formula which today is preserved in the words "I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof but only say the word and my soul shall be healed" (Matthew 8:8). By the 10th century there were different prayers for the priest and for the people. In the 13th century, due to the common practice of receiving communion only at the moment of death (hence outside the mass), prayers of confession and absolution at the bedside of a dying person were developed. These eventually would find their way into the mass as prayers prior to receiving communion.
