## Pastor's Note

Fr. Pier Pandolfo St. Joseph's Parish and St. Anthony's Mission Parish

**Christmas:** God makes room for us and we make room for Jesus

Let us first put in the big rocks. On this first day of the new year, we focus on one of the big stones of our faith, Mary's role in Jesus' birth. We celebrate that she is given a title more exalted than she ever would have imagined: Mother of God! This title reveals the importance God gives to raising up the dignity of His children, and the importance God gives to the act of freely choosing to cooperate with God's will. Mary helps us to ponder the mystery of God born among us as a simple infant and we ponder the meaning of God born of a woman.

**Homework:** identify seven big rocks and then ask if they are in your jar (see story on rocks)

The Big Rocks of Life. A teacher walks into a classroom and sets a glass jar on the table. He silently places 2-inch rocks in the jar until no more can fit. He asks the class if the jar is full and they agree it is. He says, "Really," and pulls out a pile of small pebbles, adding them to the jar, shaking it slightly until they fill the spaces between the rocks. He asks again, "Is the jar full?" They agree. So next, he adds a scoop of sand to the jar, filling the space between the pebbles and asks the question again. This time, the class is divided, some feeling that the jar is obviously full, but others are wary of another trick. So he grabs a pitcher of water and fills the jar to the brim, saying, "If this jar is your life, what does this experiment show you?" A bold student replies, "No matter how busy you think you are, you can always take on more." "That is one view," he replies. Then he looks out at the class making eye contact with everyone, "The rocks represent the BIG things in your life - what you will value at the end of your life - your family, your partner, your health, fulfilling your hopes and dreams. The pebbles are the other things in your life that give it meaning, like your job, your house, your hobbies, your friendships. The sand and water represent the 'small stuff' that fills our time, like watching TV or running errands." Looking out at the class again, he asks, "Can you see what would happen if I started with the sand or the pebbles?"

**D&P** -**The 2010s.** The Arab Spring begins in 2010 with the Tunisian Revolution and spreads to many Arab League countries. In some countries civilian demonstrations and protests are met by government violence. In Syria, thousands of people die and millions flee civil war, creating the largest refugee crisis since WWII, affecting not only the entire region but many European nations. In 2011, funding for D&P work is cut, and in March 2013 the restructuring of the Canadian government again challenges the funding for D&P work. The encyclical of Pope Francis 'On Care for Our Common Home' inspires D&P to support a campaign on the awareness of climate change and its impact on the poor and most vulnerable.

#### "PRAYER IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE"

THE REVELATION OF PRAYER - THE UNIVERSAL CALL TO PRAYER

2566 Man is in search of God. In the act of creation, God calls every being from nothingness into existence. "Crowned with glory and honor," man is, after the angels, capable of acknowledging "how majestic is the name of the Lord in all the earth." Even after losing through his sin his likeness to God, man remains an image of his Creator, and retains the desire for the one who calls him into existence. All religions bear witness to men's essential search for God.

2567 God calls man first. Man may forget his Creator or hide far from his face; he may run after idols or accuse the deity of having abandoned him; yet the living and true God tirelessly calls each person to that mysterious encounter known as prayer. In prayer, the faithful God's initiative of love always comes first; our own first step is always a response. As God gradually reveals himself and reveals man to himself, prayer appears as a reciprocal call, a covenant drama. Through words and actions, this drama engages the heart. It unfolds throughout the whole history of salvation.

Distribution of Communion:

Early Christians consumed the consecrated species in silence; then the need to verbalize the meaning resulted in various texts followed by the communicant's profession of faith, 'AMEN. Now we have the simple text 'The body (blood) of Christ'; at one time in history the priest was to say, 'May the body of our Lord Jesus Christ keep you soul unto life everlasting.' Augustine taught 'Become what you receive.'

Communion Hymn:

To fill the time that communicants are in procession Purification of vessels:

A functional task; it is to be brief and inconspicuous . Silent Prayer/song of praise:

Deep and silent prayer is important to communicate with God. Prayer after communion:

'Expresses that the 'effects' of the Eucharist be realized.
