Pastor's Note

Fr. Pier Pandolfo St. Joseph's Parish and St. Anthony's Mission Parish

'Our reach is always farther than our grasp'. Today's readings show the special place the poor and the just have in God's heart. In Zephaniah we see how the Babylonian and Assyrian conquests have reduced Israel to a lowly few, but we hear we hear how those with a humble heart find favor among this remnant. And this is paralleled in the Gospel where the reading of the Beatitudes confirms that happiness is promised to those for whom the world makes no provision – in other words, the grasp of our real life filled with pain on earth is nothing compared to how far God is helping us to reach. Homework: Pray the Eucharistic prayer, concentrating on how many times we are reaching farther with the help of God.

<u>Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, Jan18-25</u>: some successes and challenges:

Dialogue with Orthodox Churches: success on questions of feast days and celebrations, but standstill on questions of 'uniatism', namely the relationship of Rome to the other Patriarchates. Dialogue with Anglicans (ARCIC): 1998, The Gift of Authority reflects success on understanding the role of the Pope. Dialogue with Lutherans: 1999, Joint Declaration on Justification explained the common understanding for 'faith' and 'works' in the plan of salvation. Dialogues with many other communities (Methodists, Seven Day Adventists, Salvation Army, Pentecostal, Baptist, etc) have been successful in clearing up misunderstandings of each other's beliefs, and have been challenged by strong efforts to proselytize (or attract Christians away from denomination to another).

February 02: Feast of Presentation of Our Lord: we celebrate the gift of Religious Life in the Church and pray for vocations. This summer Joe Glab, our former Diocesan Youth Worker and seminarian, was solemnly professed as a Franciscan.

<u>February 11: Feast of Our Lady Of Lourdes:</u> the universal Church declared this day to be World Day of Prayer for the Sick. We reflect, support, and pray on the mystery of the sick and suffering. A special mass of anointing will be organized.

Fr.Pier's 25th anniversary celebrations: on Nov 6, I celebrate 25 years as a priest and I am organizing throughout this year various gatherings where I can say thank you for my priesthood. The first gathering is planned for Feb 11, a night of fun and games and socializing from 6 to 9pm. No gifts or cards please.

Every child in BC, born 2006 or later, can get the \$1200.00 BC Training and Education Savings Grant (BCTESG). Kids in BC also have free money waiting to get their post-secondary education savings started through the federal government's Canada Learning Bond. You only need to set up an RESP account to apply and receive the money. Without an RESP, kids miss out on the federal and provincial education savings incentives they are entitled to receive from the government.

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

"PRAYER IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE"

THE REVELATION OF PRAYER - THE UNIVERSAL CALL TO PRAYER Article 1 IN THE OLD TESTAMENT

2573 God renews his promise to Jacob, the ancestor of the twelve tribes of Israel. Before confronting his elder brother Esau, Jacob wrestles all night with a mysterious figure who refuses to reveal his name, but he blesses him before leaving him at dawn. From this account, the spiritual tradition of the Church has retained the symbol of prayer as a battle of faith and as the triumph of perseverance. Moses and the prayer of the mediator

2574 Once the promise begins to be fulfilled (Passover, the Exodus, the gift of the Law, and the ratification of the covenant), the prayer of Moses becomes the most striking example of intercessory prayer, which will be fulfilled in "the one mediator between God and men,

the man Christ Jesus."

2575 Here again the initiative is God's. From the midst of the burning bush he calls Moses. This event will remain one of the primordial images of prayer in the spiritual tradition of Jews and Christians alike. When "the God of Abraham, of Isaac, and of Jacob" calls Moses to be his servant, it is because he is the living God who wants men to live. God reveals himself in order to save them, though he does not do

this alone or despite them: he calls Moses to be his messenger, an associate in his compassion, his work of salvation. There is something of a divine plea in this mission, and only after long debate does Moses attune his own will to that of the Savior God. But in the dialogue in which God confides in him, Moses also learns how to pray: he balks, makes excuses, above all questions: and it is in response to his question that the Lord confides his ineffable name, which will be revealed through his mighty deeds.
