### Pastor's Note

Fr. Pier Pandolfo St. Joseph's Parish and St. Anthony's Mission Parish

Christmas: God makes room for us and we make room for Jesus

No one is left in darkness. Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. We sometimes speak of having "an epiphany" - a sudden, powerful realization or insight. This day celebrates the great epiphany in history that Christ is the radiant light who has come for all who sit in darkness. Christmas focused on this revelation to the shepherds, to simple ordinary people. This ancient feast of Epiphany proclaims that Jesus' coming is for the whole world, including the great, the powerful and the wise. No one is left in darkness. This light helps us to live 'a unity in diversity'. The Shepherds and the Magi represent the struggle between the Jews and the Gentiles, they represent the diversity that Jesus is calling to live in unity. Homework: Reflect on what cultural and ethnic traditions exist in our parish; and what ones are missing.

**D&P** – Celebrating 50 years. 1973 – Asia Partnership for Human Development Co-founded by Development and Peace and Australian Catholic Relief, the partnership comprises 21 Catholic development organizations from Asia, Europe, North America and Oceania. Schools continue to create these zones today.

CANADIAN Saint André Bessette His feast day is January 06. More commonly known as Brother André, he was a lay brother of the Congregation of Holy Cross, associated with St.Joseph Oratory in Montreal, and credited with thousands of reported miraculous oil healings with his pious devotion to Saint Joseph. Canonized on 17 October 2010 by Pope Benedict XVI.

#### "PRAYER IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE"

THE REVELATION OF PRAYER - THE UNIVERSAL CALL TO PRAYER

Article 1 IN THE OLD TESTAMENT

2568 In the Old Testament, the revelation of prayer comes between the fall and the restoration of man, that is, between God's sorrowful call to his first children: "Where are you?...What is this that you have one?" and the response of God's only Son on coming into the world: "Lo, I have come to do your will, O God." Prayer is bound up with human history, for it is the relationship with God in historical events.

#### Creation - source of prayer

2569 Prayer is lived in the first place beginning with the realities of creation. the first nine chapters of Genesis describe this relationship with God as an offering of the first-born of Abel's flock, as the invocation of the divine name at the time of Enosh, and as "walking with God. Noah's offering is pleasing to God, who blesses him and through him all creation, because his heart was upright and undivided; Noah, like Enoch before him, "walks with God." This kind of prayer is lived by many righteous people in all religions. In his indefectible covenant with every living creature, God has always called people to prayer. But it is above all beginning with our father Abraham that prayer is revealed in the Old Testament.

## A Journey Through the Mass

# Liturgy of the Eucharist Concluding Rites

Although the early celebration of the Eucharist seems to have ended immediately with its distribution, Christians soon felt a need to round off the liturgy with a concluding rite. Most frequently this was done by a simple dismissal which was often preceded by a blessing of the people. In both east and west this simple conclusion tended to expand. The Roman Missal of 1570, for example, called for a veneration of the altar, a greeting, a dismissal, a prayer preliminary to the blessing, another veneration of the altar, the blessing itself, and a reading of the prologue of the Gospel according to St. John. In 1884 Pope Leo XIII prescribed that certain prayers be said after Mass.

The Order of Mass has been greatly simplified and given a better structure to the concluding rite to highlight the blessing and dismissal....to be continued.
