Pastor's Note

Fr. Pier Pandolfo St. Joseph's Parish and St. Anthony's Mission Parish

'Tomorrow will take care of itself.' Today's readings are for those of us who worry too much. It may seem that our culture and our time in history have a role in creating our chattering minds and endless anxiety. News of threat and danger confront us daily. But today's Gospel reminds us that worry is a constant in life. There are lots of techniques to help us, but Jesus tells us to stay focused on the reign of God and let tomorrow take care of itself. Like all solutions and techniques, it will only work if we do it. Homework: Reflect on the sequence of GRATITUDE, followed by TRUST, followed by GENEROSITY as explained below.

STEWARDSHIP is GRATITUDE, TRUST, GENEROS-

ITY -In the Book of Genesis we read that humanity was entrusted with the responsibility of taking care of all creation; we call this STEWARDSHIP. The human resources we have to tend to the care of creation are our TIME, TALENT, and TREASURE. But these material quantities need to be governed by a spiritual program. The spiritual program begins with GRATITUDE; here we must cultivate an attitude of gratitude which allows us to see all things as a gift from God, so that even bad things become good things in the hands of God. The spiritual program follows this with TRUST; here we grow in our ability to see God always present, and that God <u>will</u> always be present to provide for our needs. Now our spiritual program can challenge us to be GEN-EROUS; only after learning to be grateful and trusting can we be generous like the birds of the air and the flowers of the field who do not worry but only freely give beauty to their surroundings. The generosity of our TIME, TALENTS, and TREASURE will be proportional to how grateful and trusting we are. Therefore, the poor need us to first be grateful and trusting.

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

"PRAYER IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE"

THE REVELATION OF PRAYER - THE UNIVERSAL CALL TO PRAYER

Article 1 IN THE OLD TESTAMENT

2582 Elijah is the "father" of the prophets, "the generation of those who seek him, who seek the face of the God of Jacob." Elijah's name, "The Lord is my God," foretells the people's cry in response to his prayer on Mount Carmel. St. James refers to Elijah in order to encourage us to pray: "The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective."

2583 After Elijah had learned mercy during his retreat at the Wadi Cherith, he teaches the widow of Zarephath to believe in the Word

of God and confirms her faith by his urgent prayer: God brings the widow's child back to life. The sacrifice on Mount Carmel is a decisive test for the faith of the People of God. In response to Elijah's plea, "Answer me, O LORD, answer me," the Lord's fire consumes the holocaust, at the time of the evening oblation. the Eastern liturgies repeat Elijah's plea in the Eucharistic epiclesis.

Finally, taking the desert road that leads to the place where the living and true God reveals himself to his people, Elijah, like Moses before him, hides "in a cleft of he rock" until the mysterious presence of God has passed by. But only on the mountain of the Transfiguration will Moses and Elijah behold the unveiled face of him whom they sought; "the light of the knowledge of the glory of God [shines] in the face of Christ," crucified and risen.
