Pastor's Note

Fr. Pier Pandolfo St. Joseph's Parish and St. Anthony's Mission Parish

"To be or not to be - Hamlet." The battle between good and evil is writ large in literature, drama and religion. Today's readings — indeed, all of Scripture — reveal a truth we know all too well. Even the best of us has experienced the powerful attraction of what we should not do. Our tradition tells us even more profoundly that the story is larger than temptation or failure; our story is about what is possible: Grace, justification, obedience, righteousness and life are the real end of the story. And our story ends this way only because we have a loving God who does not give up. Homework: Hamlets soliloquy (Act III Scene 1) "To be, or not to be- that is the question: Whether 'tis nobler in the mind to suffer The slings and arrows of outrageous fortune Or to take arms against a sea of troubles, And by opposing end them." poses a question "Do I act or do I give up?" The answer is not always clear, but as Easter reminds us that God never gives up loving us, let us pray this week that we never give up on the goodness God created in all of us.

<u>Lent:</u> the forty days of Lent are ordered towards our preparation for the great celebration of Easter -the death and resurrection of our Savior Jesus Christ. The two main purposes of Lent are to recall our baptism and to emphasize a spirit of penance. Recalling our baptism means we recall the words of God at creation "And God saw it was good" and we acknowledge that all of us are fundamentally created good. Emphasizing a spirit of penance means that we acknowledge that we sin against this goodness of creation and that penance helps us to turn back. The FORTY days remind us of (1)the forty days Noah was in the boat, (2)the forty days the Hebrew people wandered in the dessert before entering the promised land, and (3)the forty days Jesus was tempted by Satan – all of these are great moments of CONVER-SION. Our goal is to fully understand what happened at Easter and why.

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

"PRAYER IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE"

THE REVELATION OF PRAYER - THE UNIVERSAL CALL TO PRAYER

Article 1 IN THE OLD TESTAMENT

2584 In their "one to one" encounters with God, the prophets draw light and strength for their mission. Their prayer is not flight from this unfaithful world, but rather attentiveness to the Word of God. At times their prayer is an argument or a complaint, but it is always an intercession that awaits and prepares for the intervention of the Savior God, the Lord of history.

The Psalms, the prayer of the assembly

2585 From the time of David to the coming of the Messiah texts appearing in these sacred books show a deepening in prayer for one-self and in prayer for others.37 Thus the psalms were gradually collected into the five books of the Psalter (or "Praises"), the master-

work of prayer in the Old Testament.

2586 The Psalms both nourished and expressed the prayer of the People of God gathered during the great feasts at Jerusalem and each Sabbath in the synagogues. Their prayer is inseparably personal and communal; it concerns both those who are praying and all men. the Psalms arose from the communities of the Holy Land and the Diaspora, but embrace all creation. Their prayer recalls the saving events of the past, yet extends into the future, even to the end of history; it commemorates the promises God has already kept, and awaits the Messiah who will fulfill them definitively. Prayed by Christ and fulfilled in him, the Psalms remain essential to the prayer of the Church.
