Pastor's Note

Fr. Pier Pandolfo St. Joseph's Parish and St. Anthony's Mission Parish

How are we sheep? Today we are given the image of Jesus as the Shepherd (images of Jesus include: flowing water (4:14), the bread of life (6:35), life (8:12), the sheep gate (10:7), the good shepherd (10:11), the resurrection and the life (11:25), the light (12:46), the way, the truth and the life (14:6), and the vine (15:1)). That makes us sheep, not a completely flattering designation since sheep are known to be stubborn, easily frightened, and prone to get lost. But sheep also completely trust the shepherd for all their care. This is how we are sheep, learning to trust completely in Jesus who says in the Gospel,"I have come that they may have life, and have it more abundantly". Acts reminds us that this life is the promise received at our baptism and Peter reminds us that our pattern on earth is 'dying to rise again'. **Homework:** Recall the church and the priest of your baptism.

May 13, 100th anniversary of Our Lady of Fatima. The story is well known of the three young children Francisco, Jacinta, and Lucia and their 6 visons of the Blessed Virgin Mary (between May 13 and October 13 of 1917) who told the children to pray the rosary for peace. This story is connected to the miracle of the sun (October 13, 1917), the revelation of 3 secrets, and the call to pray for the conversion of Russia. On November 11, 1954, the Catholic Church officially declared the events 'worthy of belief' thereby promoting the devotion.

Prayer for Vocation

Heavenly Father, bless your Church with an abundance of Christian disciples, whom you have chosen to serve as priests and religious, married and single.

Give each of us the special graces that our particular vocations require. Form us in the image and likeness of Jesus, your Son, so that through him, with him and in him, we may act justly, love tenderly and walk humbly in your presence, now and forever.

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

"PRAYER IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE"

CHAPTER 1: THE REVELATION OF PRAYER

THE UNIVERSAL CALL TO PRAYER
Article 2: THE FULLNESS OF TIME

2607 When Jesus prays he is already teaching us how to pray. His prayer to his Father is the theological path (the path of faith, hope, and charity) of our prayer to God. But the Gospel also gives us Jesus' explicit teaching on prayer. Like a wise teacher he takes hold of us where we are and leads us progressively toward the Father. Addressing the crowds following him, Jesus builds on what they already know of prayer from the Old Covenant and opens to them the newness of the coming Kingdom. Then he reveals this newness to them in parables. Finally, he will speak openly of the Father and the Holy Spirit to his disciples who will be the teachers of prayer in his Church. 2608 From the Sermon on the Mount onwards, Jesus insists on conversion of heart: reconciliation with one's brother before presenting an offering on the altar, love of enemies, and prayer for persecutors, prayer to the Father in secret, not heaping up empty phrases, prayerful forgiveness from the depths of the heart, purity of heart, and seeking the Kingdom before all else.64 This filial conversion is entirely directed to the Father.
