Pastor's Note

Fr. Pier Pandolfo St. Joseph's Parish and St. Anthony's Mission Parish

Come Holy Spirit. Depending upon where we live, many of us are unaware of those who actually suffer because of their faith. But many circumstances can challenge our commitment: politics, economic choices, job decisions, or lifestyle. Like the early Christians, we are promised the guiding presence of the Spirit. As we look forward to Pentecost, the reading from the Acts records the spirit given in Samaria and the Gospel of John records Jesus' promise of sending the Spirit (the Advocate). This guiding presence of the spirit will help us to: "Be ready to give an explanation for the faith you have ... but do it with gentleness and reverence." How prepared are we to suffer for or at least be uncomfortable with living the Gospel? How open are we to the Spirit's influence in our lives? Homework: pray 'Holy Spirit, thank you for living this moment in me.'

HEARTS TRANSFORMED SHARING: making prayer a significant part of the day was one of the central components of the experience. At the first retreat people were introduced to the prayer of clothing one's life in Jesus. This required praying throughout the day this prayer: "Jesus thank you for living this moment in me"; and with every breath "I unite my life to your Spirit as a prayer"; and with every heartbeat "I unite with Your Heart of Limitless Love"; and with every experience "I unite with Your Merciful Presence, surrendering all feelings, thoughts, joys & pains.. resting entirely in You". The homework this week is an adaptation of this practice.

May is the month Mary and the rosary. We will pray one decade of the Rosary (one Our Father, ten Hail Mary's, and one Glory Be) as a time of communion meditation.



Important Lesson - Giving When it counts.

Many years ago, when I worked as a volunteer at a hospital, I got to know a little girl named Liz who was suffering from a rare and serious disease. Her only chance of recovery appeared to be blood transfusion from her 5-year old brother, who had miraculously survived the same disease and had developed the antibodies needed to combat the illness. The doctor explained the situation to her little brother and asked the little boy if he would be willing to give his blood to his sister. I saw him hesitate for only a moment before taking a deep breath and saying, "Yes, I'll do it if it will save her." As the transfusion progressed, he lay in bed next to his sister and smiled, as we all did, seeing the color returning to her cheek. Then his face grew pale and his smile faded. He looked up at the doctor and asked with a trembling voice, "Will I start to die right away?" Being young, the little boy had misunderstood the doctor; he thought he was going to have to give his sister all of his blood in order to save her. Yet he was willing. - Author Unknown

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

"PRAYER IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE"

CHAPTER 1: THE REVELATION OF PRAYER

THE UNIVERSAL CALL TO PRAYER
Article 2: THE FULLNESS OF TIME

2612 In Jesus "the Kingdom of God is at hand."72 He calls his hearers to conversion and faith, but also to watchfulness. In prayer the disciple keeps watch, attentive to Him Who Is and Him Who Comes, in memory of his first coming in the lowliness of the flesh, and in the hope of his second coming in glory. In communion with their Master, the disciples' prayer is a battle; only by keeping watch in prayer can one avoid falling into temptation.

2613 Three principal parables on prayer are transmitted to us by St. Luke: - the first, "the importunate friend," invites us to urgent prayer: "Knock, and it will be opened to you." To the one who prays like this, the heavenly Father will "give whatever he needs," and above all the Holy Spirit who contains all gifts. - the second, "the importunate widow," is centered on one of the qualities of prayer: it is necessary to pray always without ceasing and with the patience of faith. "and yet, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" - the third parable, "the Pharisee and the tax collector," concerns the humility of the heart that prays. "God, be merciful to me a sinner!" the Church continues to make this prayer its own: Kyrie eleison!
