Pastor's Note

Fr. Pier Pandolfo St. Joseph's Parish and St. Anthony's Mission Parish

ASCENSION - PASSING ON THE TORCH: today we remember the meaning and significance of the Feast of the Ascension. Jesus left His disciples on their own, but with the assurance that the Holy Spirit would be with them. He is leaving us, but not leaving us idle. Just the opposite! He is commissioning us to be his apostles in the world. This mandate may fill us with many emotions: fear, excitement, doubt, joy, panic, hope, etc Let us renew and deepen our faith in the promises of the risen Jesus, and turn to the Lord for guidance and strength. Let us truly be His disciples! Let us truly become His apostles! Homework: read the insert, The Reluctant Apostle.

PASSING ON THE TORCH: From disciples to apostles:

Very often we use the words 'disciple' and 'apostle' interchangeably, without realizing the important distinction between them. A 'disciple' is one who listens, one seated at the feet of the master. This is the ancient Greco-Roman model of discipleship. The disciple is like a sponge who takes in all that the master offers, to think, reason, speak and act like the master. The disciple follows a certain discipline in order to be faithful to the master. However, we cannot remain as disciples sitting forever in a comfortable pew. We are called to be apostles! An 'apostle' is one who is sent, who goes out and shares what they have heard, seen, and experienced at the feet of the master. We eventually need to take the step and – like those "Men of Galilee" stop looking up and be transformed into people of action, bearing witness to him by what we say and do. It really is in our hands now!

May is the month Mary and the rosary. We will pray one decade of the Rosary (one Our Father, ten Hail Mary's, and one Glory Be) as a time of communion meditation.

Rosary, a meditative prayer. The way to pray the rosary is by meditating on a thought while reciting the prayers in a trance like mode.



From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

"PRAYER IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE" CHAPTER 1: THE REVELATION OF PRAYER

THE UNIVERSAL CALL TO PRAYER

Article 2: THE FULLNESS OF TIME 2614 When Jesus openly entrusts to his disciples the mystery of prayer to the Father, he reveals to them what their prayer and ours must be, once he has returned to the Father in his glorified humanity. What is new is to "ask in his name."78 Faith in the Son introduces the disciples into the knowledge of the Father, because Jesus is "the way, and the truth, and the life."79 Faith bears its fruit in love: it means keeping the word and the commandments of Jesus, it means abiding with him in the Father who, in him, so loves us that he abides with us. In this new covenant the certitude that our petitions will be heard is founded on the prayer of Jesus.

2615 Even more, what the Father gives us when our prayer is united with that of Jesus is "another Counselor, to be with you for ever, even the Spirit of truth."81 This new dimension of prayer and of its circumstances is displayed throughout the farewell discourse. In the Holy Spirit, Christian prayer is a communion of love with the Father, not only through Christ but also in him: "Hitherto you have asked nothing in my name; ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full."

The Reluctant Apostle

And the Lord said, 'Go'.

And he said, 'Yes, you.'

And I said, "But I am not ready yet, and my friends are coming over, and we want to hang out at the mall. They are relying on me.' And the Lord said, 'You are stalling.'

And he said, 'I did not ask you if you wanted to.'

And I said, 'Listen, I am not the kind of person to get involved in controversy, besides, my friends won't like it, and what will the kids at school say?'

And the Lord said, 'Baloney.'

And yet a third time the Lord said, 'Go'.

And I said, 'Do I have to?'

And he said, 'Do you love me?'

And I said, Look, I am scared. People are going to laugh at me.

They will make fun of me. I cannot take it all by myself.'

And the Lord said, 'Where do you think I will be?'

And the Lord said, 'Go'.

And I sighed, 'Here I am Lord, send me.'

ROOF REPAIRS REPORT 2017

SUMMER 2015 -steeple windows replaced ~\$32,500

FALL 2016 -flat church roofs replaced ~\$54,000

SUMMER 2017 - church roof replaced \$71,500

- office roof reshingled \$11,500 - steeple reshingle \$8,200

TOTAL-----\$91,200

REASONS for repairs:

We can show our respect for the hard work of our parents by taking care of the church building they gave us.

Original roof design used 'cedar shakes' to provide appropriate air flow and ventilation; when the cedar shakes were replaced with shingles, it resulted in poor ventilation and some of our water leak problems.

Correcting the roof design to accommodate the use of shingles is the best option:

We will correct the air flow problem
We will take opportunity to insulate the roof to reduce heat loss
Current options for shingles can give us between 30 and 50 years of life
