Pastor's Note

Fr. Pier Pandolfo St. Joseph's Parish and St. Anthony's Mission Parish

PENTECOST: Church Birthday: This great Feast of Pentecost is regarded as the Birthday of the Church and is symbolized by the image of unity. Unity is power. In the face of political, religious, racial, economic, gender and other differences, we are more aware than ever of the quest for unity. Today's readings portray Jesus' followers gathered together, seeking direction. In their unity, they are empowered to love, to forgive, to proclaim and to renew the face of the earth. The world needs what Jesus bestowed upon them and upon us. We pray that the Spirit will help us to use this power for others and for our fractured world. Homework: Pray the act of contrition.

CHURCH BIRTHDAY: defining moment for apostles:

Just as every birthday is an occasion for us to reflect on our lives, where we are and where we are going, so it was for the disciples turned apostles. Jesus had been crucified and mysteriously risen from the dead, and had appeared to them on various occasions. They not only saw Him, and heard Him, but touched Him, and even ate with Him. He was indeed risen, and present. And then he ascended into heaven in their sight, not abandoning them, but further revealing to them our final destiny - to be with GOD for ever. Now suddenly, with the mysterious coming of the Holy Spirit in the form of tongues of fire, their lives were transformed yet again. They were no longer behind "locked doors ... for fear of the Jews". Rather, they were filled with courage and began praising God and witnessing to the risen Lord in a multitude of languages, languages unknown to them. The many international visitors in Jerusalem received these words of praise in their own language, confounding them as to how these Galileans could speak their language. The Spirit revealed itself through this 'gift'. The Church had begun! The mission of Jesus Christ would continue through these apostles of the Lord!

Our church is growing: Over the next two months it will be our pleasure to welcome many babies through baptism, 3 children from the school through the sacraments of initiation (baptism, confirmation, and holy communion), and 9 children continuing their journey of faith by receiving their first of many holy communions. From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

"PRAYER IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE"

CHAPTER 1: THE REVELATION OF PRAYER

THE UNIVERSAL CALL TO PRAYER

Article 2: THE FULLNESS OF TIME

2616 Prayer to Jesus is answered by him already during his ministry, through signs that anticipate the power of his death and Resurrection: Jesus hears the prayer of faith, expressed in words (the leper, Jairus, the Canaanite woman, the good thief)84 or in silence (the bearers of the paralytic, the woman with a hemorrhage who touches his clothes, the tears and ointment of the sinful woman).85 The urgent request of the blind men, "Have mercy on us, Son of David" or "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" has-been renewed in the traditional prayer to Jesus known as the Jesus Prayer: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner!"86 Healing infirmities or forgiving sins, Jesus always responds to a prayer offered in faith: "Your faith has made you well; go in peace." St. Augustine wonderfully summarizes the three dimensions of Jesus' prayer: "He prays for us as our priest, prays in us as our Head, and is prayed to by us as our God. Therefore let us acknowledge our voice in him and his in

The prayer of the Virgin Mary

2617 Mary's prayer is revealed to us at the dawning of the fullness of time. Before the incarnation of the Son of God, and before the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, her prayer cooperates in a unique way with the Father's plan of loving kindness: at the Annunciation, for Christ's conception; at Pentecost, for the formation of the Church,

his Body. In the faith of his humble handmaid, the Gift of God found the acceptance he had awaited from the beginning of time. She whom the Almighty made "full of grace" responds by offering her whole being: "Behold I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be [done] to me according to your word." "Fiat": this is Christian prayer: to be wholly God's, because he is wholly ours. Jesus hears our prayer.
