

## WHAT HAVE CATHOLICS CONTRIBUTED

Archbishop Fulton Sheen once said, "There are not even 100 people in this country who hate the Catholic Church, but there are millions who hate what they think the Catholic Church to be." 1. Light and the cosmos: (1)Franciscan Roger Bacon (d 1292) at the request of Pope Clement IV, largely initiated the tradition of optics in the Latin world - the first spectacles were invented in Italy around 1300, an application of lenses that developed later into telescopes and microscopes; (2)the Gregorian Calendar (1582), now used worldwide, is a fruit of work by Catholic astronomers, (3)as is the development of astrophysics by the spectroscopy of Fr Angelo Secchi (d 1878); (4)the Big Bang, was invented by a Catholic priest, Fr Georges Lemaître (d 1966,), a historical fact that is almost never mentioned. Future areas will include optics, science, philosophy, education, law, music, architecture, literature, language
